We had some issues with the elevator system; thanks to Bill Crier, it is now operating correctly and the rust problems have been addressed.


Friday night Birthday Bash is a well-attended evening. It's a great time to bring prospective members to our Club. It's really special when the British Brass Band is performing.

WSB Grow- out Pen Update:


All the 18,000 juvenile White Sea Bass are doing well with very few mortalities.



Doc Lines

Classical Guitar Recital, Music, and fMRI

History was made in May. For the first time, Bach and Mozart were played on guitar and heard live in the Great Hall at CIYC. Two brothers, Alex and Wesley Park, played these pieces on Ramirez-made classical guitars. Both are students at the Pepperdine School of Music, under the direction of Maestro Christopher Parkening. The guitar program was outstanding, the best we've ever had. There were about one hundred attendees; they really enjoyed the performance and gave three standing ovations.

This brings me to what happens to the brain when listening to music. When brain cells "think" they use glucose in large amounts, and they get it from circulating blood. To get more glucose, they signal some helper cells (astrocytes) to produce nitric oxide, which dilates the blood vessels (similar to Viagra). Thus, the vessels bring more glucose, enabling the brain cells to "think" more.

We can image this increase of blood flow on MRI. Because it indirectly measures brain function (more blood flow = more "thinking going on"), it's called functional MRI or fMRI. Increased flow is pictured as an appearance and intensity of colors in different brain regions on a series of images.

Now, when we listen to music, the brain lights up. Almost all parts light up in rich colors. And when we play music, the brain lights up like a Christmas tree. The parts that remember, read, hear, move fingers, interpret, intonate, introduce emotions, and find the rhythm, are all coordinating and working over-time. And that's what was happening to us and to the Park brothers. How great was that?!

Board of Supervisors Approves Fisherman's Wharf 390 Unit Apartment Complex Over <u>Community Objections</u>

At the June 14thmeeting of the Ventura County Board of Supervisors, the Harbor Director proposed an amendment to the Harbor Public Works Plan which the Board approved. Amendment #7:

- Allows a mixed use complex of luxury high-rent apartments on the Harbor waterside off of Victoria Boulevard, south of Channel Islands Boulevard. The complex will include 36,000 square feet of retail and commercial space at the Fisherman's Wharf location.
- Increases the height allowable on the waterside from 35 to 55 feet.
- Eliminates 4 acres of overnight and overflow parking of boat trailers and RVs for public boat launch ramp users. This means no space for expanding parking capacity for recreational boaters with boat trailers at the harbor for the next 65 years.
- The net result is a loss of 129 parking spaces per the December 7, 2009, South Central Coastal Commission letter. This is in addition to the over 21% loss of parking space in the current boat launch parking area due to the increase in parking space size required per the Department of Boating and Waterways.

The amendment was approved despite the fact there is no comprehensive Environmental Impact Report (EIR) including a thorough traffic study. No consultation was made prior to proposing the amendment with the Port Hueneme School District or the Navy Base and other community organizations, which may be impacted by this development and may require mitigation to parts of the project.

These changes are contrary to the policies of the Harbor's Public Works Plan, "Harbor recreational boating facilities shall be protected." It also contradicts what the Harbor Director said at the 2013 opening of the renovated public boat launch ramp as reported in the Ventura County Star.

"The most affordable way to do boating is to have the boat at your house on a trailer and bring it. This is for boaters who want easy access and don't live on the water...Our primary focus is boating and access to the water."

The community questioned why a development that conflicts with the harbor's primary purpose i.e. to serve recreational boaters and promote water activities is being proposed.

The community asked why did the harbor invested in a Boating Center to instruct the boaters of tomorrow, if they may find themselves with inadequate facilities in 5, 10, 15 years to accommodate their boats and trailers?

With the proposed 65-year lease, how does the Harbor propose to serve the long-term interests of boaters and ensure their easy and affordable access to the Harbor?

The proposal will next go through the California Coastal Commission's review process that may result in mitigations, and possible approval. (cont'd on next page)





<u>CSUCI Director of Community and Government Affairs Speaks at CIYC's June 8th</u> <u>Wednesday Dinner</u>

Celina Zacarius, the Director of Community and Government Affairs for the University, and Josh Wade, Manager of the Boating Center, attended the Wednesday night dinner during which they provided an informative update on the current plans and activities of the Channel Islands Boating Center. This also provided members an opportunity to ask questions they had about the Center since its opening.

Questions such as:

Why is the Boating Center open only from 10am-4pm Mondays –Fridays and not on weekends where the public may be most able to visit the center? Answer given: Limited staff - there are only 2 full-time staff members and a few part-time university students.

Why are the docks not accessible for public use? Answer given: This is due to limited staffing as at least one staff is required to be present when the docks are in use. There was also the issue of liability insurance and the county indemnifying the university in case there are incidents where someone may be injured.

What can be done to give the public more access to the Boating Center? Answer given: The University has not had an operating contract with the County since it opened 3 years ago. They are waiting to get the contract back from the Harbor Department and County before they can resolve this matter.

Ms Zacarius agreed to look into giving the Pacific Corinthian Youth Foundation access to their docks for ADA boaters, as requested by Jack Schuler, President of the Foundation.

She also agreed to see if there was any way the Boating Center could participate in some of the CIYC activities such as the Disabled Veterans' Sail Day.

Ms. Zacarius also mentioned that they are considering an Open House Event at the Boating Center for the community sometime in August around the Equinox. This might be an opportunity for the Harbor Yacht Clubs to participate in an event with the Boating Center.

Several members also voiced their frustration regarding the public's limited access to the Boating Center. The yacht clubs had been promised access to the Boating Center facilities when the project was being proposed and needed the harbor community's support. However, since that time, there has been no access and no communication with the yacht clubs. Hopefully, by working with Ms. Zacarius and Mr. Wade, some of the issues will be resolved.
