


George Helwig, George and Mavis Goldsmith



#### TransPac Report

#### Crew provides a "Second Chance" to stranded kayaker

The crew of Second Chance was in the right place at the right time!! We had the opportunity to rescue Guy Wilding, the coach for the USA kayaking team. He is originally from Australia and now lives in Honolulu.

Guy was doing a kayaking run that he did every other day from Waikiki to Diamond Head and back in an Epic V-10. The return became problematic when his paddle hit what Guy thought was a turtle and broke. He was thrown out of the kayak and lost the paddle, but was able to swim back to the kayak and hold onto it.

His wife Shelly expected him home by 10 or 10:30 that morning and when he wasn't back on time, she went to check that his car was still in the parking lot where he left it to go kayaking and then called a few friends. At about 12:30, she called the Coast Guard and the local police to report his failure to return in a timely manner; however, neither agency was concerned and told her he was probably in Honolulu somewhere, despite the fact his car was still in the parking lot without the kayak.

Second Chance about 1 ½ miles from the finish line and looking for a red buoy when we spotted Guy – it's amazing how many buoys are there near Diamond Head! Fortunately for all concerned, Guy had on a bright red shirt. Once the crew determined he was in trouble and waiving to us, everyone went into rescue mode. Keep in mind we were doing about 11+ knots in the Molokai Channel. The Channel is known for rough seas and nasty currents and we had all that plus wind gusts.

Everyone on the crew reacted admirably and followed Skipper Harry's directions and lead as well. As anyone who knows Harry would expect, he gave his clear directions in a calm tone of voice. Captain Phil Sauer kept his eye on Guy; Mary headed below to radio the US Coast Guard; and the boat was turned into the wind to drop sails and the engine was started. As we went back to Guy, we deployed the Man Overboard Module for him and ended up hooking a halyard to him to lift him out of the water. Guy is about 6'2-3" and 220 pounds of solid muscle. Once he was on the boat and we had a moment to analyze his condition, which was very good for being in the water about 4 ½ hours, we got him downstairs to get him warmed up and to call his wife. Fortunately, the shirt and swimsuit he had on were the type of material that dries very quickly and it didn't take very long for him to get warmed up. The water was in the high 70's or low 80's so he wasn't terribly cold.

We tried to reach his wife on her cell phone, but were unable to reach her immediately. No doubt she was still trying to marshal forces to go find her husband. Guy left her a message and she was a very happy lady when she called back.

We all had the good fortune to meet Shelly Wilding when she greeted us at the dock. Shelly was accompanied by the reporters and photographers and our very own Sara Sorensen and Andrea Kucera!! One of the photographers, who is also a kayaker, thanked us for saving their "icon."

Guy actually apologized for interrupting our race – we couldn't believe that someone who had been in the water for over 4 ½ hours hanging onto a kayak and who was facing a decision whether to continue to hang onto the kayak hoping a boat would come by or try to swim for it through the rough seas and current was actually apologizing to us for interrupting our race!!

On a personal note, I have never been so proud to have been a crew member with these admirable men. They were wonderful crew mates; darn good sailors; and I would do it again in a heartbeat with them. Mary






