Relatively new members Gary Johnson's 2.7lb Sheepshead and Joyce Johnson's 33.6lb Halibut won the Men's and Women's Annual Tournament trophies this year. which may be a first. Unfortunately they were on a Cruise with their family that was scheduled in advance, so they were not present for the dinner.

Eric Ireland won big fish of the Year for his 47.2lb White Sea Bass caught off the Dawn Patrol. The cash prize was \$100 and his name on the **Big Fish of the Year** Trophy.

This year's **Sportsman of the Year Trophy** was awarded to **Don Dickey** in recognition of all his work on the WSB pens and participation in the Anglers programs. Don took over this year as the WSB Grow-out Pen Coordinator for CIYC.

WSB Pen Update:

The Pens are empty right now after releasing 9200+ fish in October. We opted to leave the pens empty for the winter so we can do much needed repairs and upgrades. We hope to be able to replace some of the nets and improve the above water containment fencing and roof.

In the next few weeks, we will need to remove and discard the orange fencing that we used to line the predator nets. We will be calling for volunteer helpers for that soon.

During the Annual Anglers Awards Dinner, we had a raffle that raised \$410 earmarked for the WSB Pens. Thank you to Laurie Preston for selling tickets. We also have some commitments from club members for additional

donations.

Reminder: Rock fish season ends December 31st and doesn't reopen until March 1st 2013! Additionally the depth restriction for rockfish has been raised from 360ft to 300ft for the remainder of 2012.

White Seabass Program Overview

The Ocean Resources Enhancement and Hatchery Program (OREHP) is an experimental hatchery program investigating the feasibility of using cultured marine finfish to successfully enhance wild fish populations White seabass are spawned and reared at a hatchery in Carlsbad, which is owned and operated by Hubbs-Sea World Research Institute (HSWRI). The hatchery provides juvenile white seabass, 4 inches in length, to 13 grow-out facilities operated by volunteers throughout southern California. The fish are held at the grow-out facilities until they are ready for release, typically at around 8 to 10 inches in length.

OREHP is one of the few stocking programs dedicated to assessing the biological and economic impacts of its releases, and it is the only program of its kind on the West Coast of North America. Through its responsible approach and extensive, self-imposed scientific review process, OREHP has established itself as a model for stocking programs worldwide.

History


The OREHP began in 1982 with legislation (Assembly Bill 1414) authored by California Assemblyman Larry Stirling. Initially, research was focused on California halibut and white seabass; however, research eventually focused exclusively on white seabass because of the depressed condition of the stock and its higher value to both the recreational and commercial fisheries.


The OREHP is funded through the sale of ocean enhancement stamps on DFG sport and commercial fishing licenses. The stamps are required for all saltwater anglers fishing south of Point Arguello, California (Santa Barbara County). Additional funding comes from the Federal Sportfish Restoration Act (SFRA). The OREHP is managed by DFG with the assistance of an advisory panel consisting of academic and management agency scientists, representatives of both commercial and recreational fishing groups, and the aquaculture industry. Members of the panel provide policy direction, review research proposals, and recommend allocation of funds for the OREHP.

Milestones

- October 1986 The first experimental release of more than 2,000 juvenile white seabass took place in Mission Bay (San Diego, California). Fish were propagated and raised at HSWRI's Mission Bay laboratory.
- March 1992 The first legal-sized, oxytetracycline-marked, hatchery-raised white seabass was recaptured
- October 1995 The marine fish hatchery became operational, built on land donated by San Diego Gas & Electric Company on Agua Hedionda Lagoon in Carlsbad, California. The marine fish hatchery was funded as an environmental mitigation measure for the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (owners include Southern California Edison, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and the cities of Anaheim and Riverside). Contributions for the construction of the marine fish hatchery also came from private, corporate, and foundation donors
- June 1999 first legal-sized, coded-wire tagged, hatchery-raised white seabass was recaptured
- 2001 The first year more than 100,000 white seabass were released in southern California waters
- October 2004 The one millionth white seabass was released
- **December 2006 -** 1.21 million fish released
- June 2007 Oldest adult fish recovery (13.31 years). The fish was released off Santa Barbara, California in 1994 and recovered near Ventura, California
- June 2008 One hundredth hatchery-raised white seabass recapture
- March 2009- 33.8lb White Seabass tagged for Channel Islands Growout facility and released September 1997 was Caught near Catalina Island.
- **2012** over 2million fish released so far.











