

Both were later in the Ice Follies and shared many stories with us in the CIYC lounge after dinner. Nancy was social chairperson when I was Commodore.

Often, P/C Dave Gable brings his guitar into the fireplace room, strums about any song you may like. If you see Andrea Kucera arrive with her violin case, she will probably join Dave for a musical treat for all in earshot. Do not miss them if you see them playing in the fireplace room. 





We have a good deal of summer left and there is never a better time than right now to save yourself as well as a loved one. The coast guard auxiliary and power squadron occasionally offer a short one day course titled "SUDDENLY IN COMMAND". Upon completion of this course you will have basic knowledge of a boats operation, communication skills, firefighting techniques, navigation and many other useful and life saving survival techniques. The coast guard has a saying, "have respect for the sea because it has no respect for you".

I hope this gives you all some food for thought. I know that there are many skilled boaters in our club and maybe there will come a time when they can give a class like this.

Anglers' Corner

As I sit writing this it is mid-August I'm preparing for the upcoming Channel Islands Billfish Tourney. The water temps are unseasonably cool and do not bode well for Marlin Tournaments. My research indicates only 3 Marlin caught and released as of 8-18-10 in SoCal waters, definitely not a good sign!

NOAA finally admitted we are in a LA Niña (cold water cycle):

'EL NIÑO/SOUTHERN OSCILLATION (ENSO) DIAGNOSTIC DISCUSSION issued by CLIMATE PREDICTION CENTER/NCEP/NWS 5 August 2010

ENSO Alert System Status: La Niña Advisory

Synopsis: La Niña conditions are expected to strengthen and last through the Northern Hemisphere winter 2010-11.

During July 2010 La Niña conditions developed, as negative sea surface temperature (SST) anomalies strengthened across the central and eastern equatorial Pacific Ocean.

Nearly all models predict La Niña to continue through early 2011 (Fig. 6). However, there is disagreement among the models over the eventual strength of La Niña. Most dynamical models generally predict a moderate-to-strong La Niña, while the majority of the statistical model forecasts indicate a weaker episode. Given the strong cooling observed over the last several months and the apparent ocean-atmosphere coupling (positive feedback), the dynamical model outcome of a moderate-to-strong episode is favored at this time. Therefore, La Niña conditions are expected to strengthen and last through Northern Hemisphere Winter 2010-11.'

The good news is with all the nutrient rich upwelling there is tons of life and bait out there, just not the exotic Pelagic fish we crave to fish for.
