Angler's Corner

Happy New Year!! As I'm sure you know Rockfish season is closed until March 1st. In the mean time, there should be some opportuni-

ties for winter Calico Bass, and a few halibut. The Calicos are hunkered down in the depths. A slow retrieve of leadhead plastic lure bumping along the bottom should produce in the right areas. One of the area's that has produced for me in the past is the Deep Hole area south of Point Mugu..

Angler's dues of \$10 for the 2008-fishing season are now due. You may send in your dues with your regular club dues billing. For only ten bucks, you will have a distinctive looking fish next to your name in the CIYC Roster; be eligible for the \$50 Big Fish of the Month Award, be able to participate in all of the club tournaments and perhaps win \$100 Big Fish of the Year Award.

Many months go by when no or few fish are weighed in, which means that the ¼ lb mackerel may be worth \$50 bucks, so weigh them in! An Angler can only win once a year so we should have 12 different winners.

In the last year Anglers, funds were used to purchase a computer, software, and peripherals for the office and bar. In addition, funds were used to help pay for furniture in the entry way..

Dave Wilhite's Report

Happy New Year Boaters and Waterfront Lovers

Weather: Other than being a colder than normal Indian summer fall the winds have been keeping most boaters at the docks. Northwesterly and Northeast are our prevailing winds thru January. Be aware after the first of the year we can get heavy southeast winds and swells that usually develop rainy weather close behind. I recently had an unusual weather window to deal with traveling to Santa Rosa and San Miguel fishing lobster and rockfish for three days.

The weather channel VHF weather 3 predicted the first day southeast to 15-20 knots day light winds and turning northwest at knight 15-25 with the second day the same. The second night was predicted to go 20 to 50 knots northwest with the huge eastern pacific westerly swells to 40 feet.

We had a group of 4 going and the two from Morro Bay canceled due to high warnings. We are fortunate our Islands have good protection in theses conditions. We left at noon the first day and arrived at Santa Rosa about 4pm. The wind was from the Southeast so we anchored at Southeast Anchorage and were comfortable the night. The next day we decide to move on up to San Miguel to fish rockfish and this is where we hit the 15-25 knots of west breeze fortunately we were on a 60,000.00

The owner of the boat and I discussed the weather fairly extensively into the evening to where he was confident enough to hold over again at Northwest Anchorage. The winds did hit 40 knots thru the night but we held well with little discomfort other than the howling of the wind passing by the boat.

We stay at anchor and fillet our limits of Red Snapper and miscellaneous rock fish and headed home. Upon arriving back a Ventura Harbor we found the huge swells that we predicted breaking across the entrance. Timing sets (a group of wave 4-5) of swells comes into play in this condition. We pay close attention staying safely outside the break and see how much time

Once we figure this time we are able to know whether we have the boat speed to cover the distance needed to go to safety inside the harbor. In this case we had time to spare maybe 10-15 seconds. I simply inch my way to where the swells were peaking and waited for the 4 wave to pass under the boat and hit the throttle to keep just behind and follow it into the harbor. A safer option is to go to Channel Islands Harbor when swell warnings are out and take your boat home when the swell re-

Remain cautious always listen to the weather #3 channel for heavy weather. This data seems to be in the 95-98% reliability range our whole trip was close weather conditions and the information made it possible to have another great fishing adven-

Boats: I remain amazed that so many new boaters are buying boats that do not suit our local and island boating. The worst part of this happening is the new boaters will not experience the true experience but one where the boat was not seaworthy or designed for our weather. I guess the question here is what do you do with the 90% dysfunctional boats? Better yet how does one get the information needed to make the proper decision before destroying his interest on a bad boat? Something to ponder.

Fishing: In finishing up on the rockfish exploring we did manage to get to the spots inside the West End of Santa Rosa Island and Wycoff Ledge on the back side of San Miguel Island. All the areas had high volumes of nice rockfish to 10 pounds. My final thoughts on the areas I feel are best based on distance needed to travel and volume and quality of fish?

Locally I think the 17 Fathom spot (Hidden Reef) 27 miles at 160-170 compass shows most volume and quality. Outside reefs I think inside the West End of Santa Rosa holds the best quality with 5-7 pound Red Snapper and Chuckle Head.

My personal choice San Miguel for its solitary and beauty. Note we are establishing Channel Islands Tuna Club January 1, 2008. More info to be forwarded. The club will have events for families and big game anglers alike.
