So far the Big Fish for November was caught by Bob Deyling with a 2.5 lb Rockfish. He and Dick Olsen worked the area down towards Deep Hole during a midweek get away.

If no other big fish are turned in by December 1st, the **BIG FISH OF THE YEAR** will be **Georgie Olsen's** 19.9 lb Halibut caught by her during the Annual Ladies Fishing Tournament. The prize will be awarded during the Annual Recognition Dinner on December 20th.

Last month I wrote about the Pacific Fisheries Management Council's possible closure of the Thrasher Shark fishery next year. The PFMC, after hearing public comment and council input has decided not to recommend a recreational closure for thresher sharks at this time. However they did strongly recommend a new stock assessment, increased data collection, increased research on mortality, and more public education and outreach.

Please practice reasonable restraint in accessing this sensitive fishery. Take only what you intend to eat and release the rest. Sportsmen were the original Conservationists lets keep it that way.





Hello Boaters and Hello Boaters and Waterfront Lovers,

Again we had a great month of weather in October with mild Santa Ana offshore winds and gentle southwest onshore conditions.

This is a great time to cruise up and see Point Conception and the anchorage's following the coast home. I think, to do the cruise it would require 2 nights and three day's. The first day make the run for El Capitan Beach Anchorage, which is very scenic with lots of very old palm trees and white sandy beaches. Generally the surf is small in the bay and will not be to hard to make a beach landing and wander around a bit. Next day leave fairly early and hug the scenic coast line going by Gaviota Pier and Trestles Beach on up to Point Conception Lighthouse. Be sure to take your camera the lighthouse is one of the beautiful lighthouses that I have seen in my travels including the Great Lakes and Eastern seaboard.

The entire coast between El Capitan Beach and Point Conception always brought too my mind what most of Southern California must have looked like 100 or so years ago.

After having lunch here and getting a full viewing head back down to Goleta Bay. Here you will find another pier white sands beaches. If you fish this bay it holds a lot of halibut. Take a couple of hoop nets with you for catching lobster and crabs. Goleta beach also is a fairly calm area for beach landings. The only downside is the air traffic noise from planes coming out of Santa Barbara Airport.

If you want keep going to Santa Barbara Harbor get a slip and enjoy the activities. Another coastal weekend cruise/fish/hoop trap lobsters is Paradise Cove. Happy Cruising.

FISHING

Fish reports have been on the quite side with most reporting few large catches. Anglers are targeting the rockfish on the pinnacles between Santa Cruise and Anacapa Island. The ling cod move to these high spots to spawn in the fall and will be most aggressive during these months before January seasonal close.

My recommendation to catch the bigger ling cod and rockfish in general is to single hook with small live mackerel. Simply tie a size 3/O Mustad live bait hook to the dead end of your line move up 2 feet and tie a 3" inch loop in your line for your sinker, move up 3 more feet and tie another 150 pound test swivel in line. The upper swivel will be far enough down on the two foot leader below your sinker not to be able to reach the upper swivel and spin the bait around the main line as you send your bait to the bottom. Hook your bits under the jaw and out the top of the head keeping the bait fish mouth closed for minimal sponge on decent to the bottom of the ocean.

Use enough weight to keep line angle to a minimum so that you can feel the fish biting 150 to 250 feet away.

Most novices make the mistake of reeling in their fish fast. Your better of reeling slow and getting the fish to the boat. Fish spin more when pulled thru the water fast eventually spinning off the hooks before surfacing.

To catch live mackerel simply buy a few cans of cat food with fish flavor and sprinkle off the channel end of your slip. Use a Zupiki bait catcher with size 10 hooks for best results.
