# Message From The Commodore **Larry Golkin**







August was truly "august" for the Channel Islands Yacht Club. So many great things happened. We had some excellent events and thanks to all those who stepped up to put them on and to those who participated. We have some excellent events coming up in September that we hope will be successful and enjoyed by all.

I spend a good amount of time talking with Past Commodores because I learn so much. Tom Naylor, Dana Hamilton, Dick Olsen, Joyce Sheridan, and Jack Borkowski, in particular have been very helpful to me. I am grateful for their guidance. They have all been at CIYC for many years and have each served their club well. This would be a much more difficult job if it were not for these folks. They have each helped me navigate what some would call a minefield. I was only a member of CIYC for 5 years before taking the helm as your Commodore. I have said it before, and I will say it again; a one year term is rather short. It takes several months to learn as many of the ins and outs of the club as possible before one can say they know anything, and then it's just about over. Be that as it may, it has been a great learning experience. I am grateful to have had this opportunity.

Since the beginning of this year, we have all experienced many changes. The intent of the Board and Bridge was to bring sound business practices into play, to generate more income for the club, and to control costs, thereby establishing a solid base for the club's financial wherewithal on a going forward basis. Additionally, the intent of the Board and Bridge was to make the club a place where folks can come and have a breath of freshness; to enjoy new and different, and more abundant opportunities to have fun engaging your fellow members. I believe we have just about accomplished this. We have a few more things to hone down, but we are getting very close to achieving our goals. I know that the "flavor" of things has changed, but our mission remains the same.

I spend a lot of time worrying about this club and how it's going to fair in the future. I have been told not to worry about it; that the club has always been hanging by a thread. I certainly recognize that the club has been around for nearly 50 years before this Board and Bridge, and that it will likely be here for another 50 years after we are done. So what's to be concerned about, right? Well, having spent as much time as I have studying the numbers, I can't help but be concerned.

Having spent nearly a year working on the club's finances, I have concluded that it will be very difficult to generate more income that we currently are given the restrictions we have in terms of available space and facilities. We cannot charge more for dinners. In fact, some argue we should charge less. We have had to increase drink prices a little because we have to keep up with increased taxes and product cost. Yet, increasing drink prices a dollar across the board (fifty cents on beer) is merely a Band-Aid on a bullet wound. What I believe we need to do is increase our membership to at least 250. The Board agrees.

In an effort to increase our membership, the Board has decided to temporarily (for the next 4 months) reduce the price of the membership certificate back to where it was in 2006 to \$750. Some of you may recall that Past Commodore Colleen Nix and her board raised it to \$1500. While I agree that we should not sell ourselves cheap, we need to act now to generate a rapid infusion of dues income in order to help cover the budget for 2010, our 50<sup>th</sup> year. Our operation should be able to run on its dues income budgeted and expensed throughout the year and simply enjoy the benefits of, as opposed to relying upon, the other income generated by the bar, dinners, and other activities so that we can save for our future. Right now, saving money for the future is all but impossible. So if you know some folks who want to join our club, now may be the best time in a while to do so.

Summer is almost gone. My year as Commodore is almost complete. We have a few more months in 2009 before we must begin preparations for our Golden Anniversary. Yes, CIYC will be 50 years old in 2010. Our new Board has been nominated and will be elected at the end of this month. Our new Bridge will be seated in October. Keep up the good work and good things will come. Love each other and respect each other. We are a stunningly unique bunch of characters. Let's all just make "it" happen. All the best to you all.

# Angler's Corner Frank Sullivan

Anglers' Corner September 09

The <u>NOAA El Niño website</u>, **http://www.elnino.noaa.gov/** is still calling for an increasing El Nino effect. (A majority of the model forecasts for the Niño-3.4 SST index suggest El Niño will continue to strengthen. While there is disagreement on the eventual strength of El Niño, nearly all of the dynamical models predict a moderate-to-strong El Niño during the Northern Hemisphere Winter 2009-10. A strengthening El Niño during the next few months is also suggested by the recent westerly wind event in the western equatorial Pacific, which can lead to additional anomalous warmth across the central and east-central equatorial Pacific during the next two months. Therefore, current conditions and model forecasts favor the continued development of a weak-to-moderate strength El Niño into the Northern Hemisphere Fall 2009, with the likelihood of at least a moderate strength El Niño (3-month Niño-3.4 SST index of +1.0°C or greater) during the Northern Hemisphere Winter 2009-10)

The truth is that, at the time I write this, the water temps around the Islands has actually cooled to the mid 60's the last few weeks and the Marlin Season is getting off to a slow start. Hopefully, the waters will warm up in the next few weeks in time for the CI Billfish Invitational Tournament hosted by CIYC. Fewer WSB are showing up in the counts but there are plenty of log barracuda being caught as well as a good count of calico and sand bass.

So far <u>no one</u> has turned in a fish for the August Big Fish of the Month.

## A Little More History

In 1958 the breakwater for our harbor had just been constructed. CIYC was the original yacht club in our harbor, founded in 1960. Hubert Catlin was our first Commodore. By 1962 our small harbor was more like a pond, and we had no docks. A group of our members who were mainly interested in sailing would spin off to form Anacapa Yacht Club in 1967. One of those members, Dick McCune, would become the 1968 Mid Winter National Champion. Another of those racing members, Dick Veithoen, was the City Manager of Port Hueneme. Yet in spite of the loss of these members, CIYC continued to grow.

By March of 1969 our club numbers swelled to 250 regular members, 39 junior members and 14 honorary members. Past secretaries Sara Roberts and her husband, James and Helen and Carl Straub belonged. Others you might remember are Jimmy and Artie Donlon, Martin and Martha Smith, Leo and Della Foster, George and Mavis Goldsmith (parents of Past Commodore Evan Hughes' wife, Kim) and Claude and Helen Castle.

Our original clubhouse was a one-story building. The combined visiting/eating area was in our current lobby, next to the kitchen. The bar area was where the offices are now. A great deal of comradeship occurred within that small lobby area. Larger club functions, like the Awards' Dinners or Installation Dinners, were held at the Elks Lodge on South "A" Street, or the Colonial House Restaurant on Oxnard Blvd.

During much of their idle time, however, the club members enjoyed water activities. CIYC was participating in a full calendar of sailboat races. Channel Islands to Newport and then Newport to Ensenada was one of those races. We held a Fishing Derby from February through September. Coast Chandlery was the official weighing station. We also had a schedule of Predicted Log Races. CIYC had affiliated with the SCYA, SBCYA and SCCA. It is interesting to note that one of our cruises to Smuggler's Cove was for an "Island Party", hosted by the Santa Barbara YC. In May of 1969 we held what was called our "First Annual Open House".

CIYC's past yields many colorful stories. The actor, John Carradine, was a club member at that time. Years ago George Goldsmith told me the story about the night when Carradine's apartment at the Bahia Cabrillo caught fire. As he cautiously descended on a ladder wearing his navy peacoat, the fireman yelled, "Are you all right?" John casually pulled a cigarette from his pocket and asked, "Anyone got a light?"

I also want to announce that, subject to the CIYC boards Acceptance of the Deed of Gift, I will donate to the club


