Forecast on Timing of Harbor Improvements and Projects

There have been ongoing questions about the anticipated timing of improvements to harbor facilities and progress on approved major projects. Here is the status of their progress:

Karls at Fisherman's Wharf

Karls is finalizing their project plans, expected to be submitted to the City of Oxnard for building permits by the end of this year. It is projected that Karls will open in Spring, 2027.

Hyatt Place Hotel on Peninsula Road

Brighton is now revising their construction plan for the hotel. Their plan needs to be brought up to the current building code standards. The Harbor Director expects them to submit their updated plan to the County by January of 2026. Brighton is also working on improving their loan rates.

Kids Playground Next to Marina Emporium

The project's start date is now anticipated to be about 12 months away. That puts its start date sadly into Fall of 2026.

Whale's Tail

The Harbor Department is considering demolishing the building. The condition of the building, as many are aware, is poor and the thinking is, it would be better to start a new development with a cleared lot. This may need community support at the County Board of Supervisors.

Marina Docks and Slips Renovation

The pile driving at Bahia Marina is scheduled to be completed on October 5th and the Marina completed by Suntex this year. Once Bahia is completed, Suntex plans to start on the Peninsula Yacht Anchorage. Suntex is also looking to buy Vintage Marina and Channel Islands Harbor Marina. The lease transfer for these marinas is anticipated to go to the County Board of Supervisors for approval in October. Any concerns should be addressed before it goes to a vote at the Board of Supervisors.

The Harbor Department has been told by Blackstone that they will complete Anacapa Isle Marina this year. This will depend on Bellingham's operational capacity.

Marina Emporium Facilities

Per the Harbor Department, Suntex is considering rec-lading the older building similar to the other newer modern one. They are also considering constructing a new small building for the fishermen. Prior to any renovation of these buildings, Suntex must submit their plans to the Harbor Department for approval.

New Building for Harbor Department and Harbor Patrol

The old building was deemed unsafe and will be demolished soon. The Harbor Department is now housed in temporary trailer facilities. Plans for the new building have been submitted to be checked by Building and Safety and the Harbor Department is waiting for their review comments.

Repaving of Harbor Boulevard Parking Lots

The Harbor Department is waiting for Southern California Edison to schedule coordination support for repaving of the parking lots.

The plan is now to repave in the next 18 months which is much later than expected.

Harbor Dredging by USACE

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Los Angeles District, in coordination with Ventura County, is returning to complete maintenance dredging at the harbor in early October and may extend through February 2026. Manson Construction of Seattle, USACE's contractor, will be completing the work. The plan is to increase the total cumulative dredge to between 2.2 and 2.5 million cubic yards. Dredged material is hydraulically pumped and deposited onto Hueneme Beach about one mile south. This provides needed shoreline protection to downcoast beaches. The project is a 24/7 operation but the use of heavy equipment on Silver Strand is restricted between 7am – 7pm. The contractor may shut down operations during the holiday breaks of Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day during which time a small portable generator will be used to maintain continuous power to critical systems. A small crew will monitor the equipment.

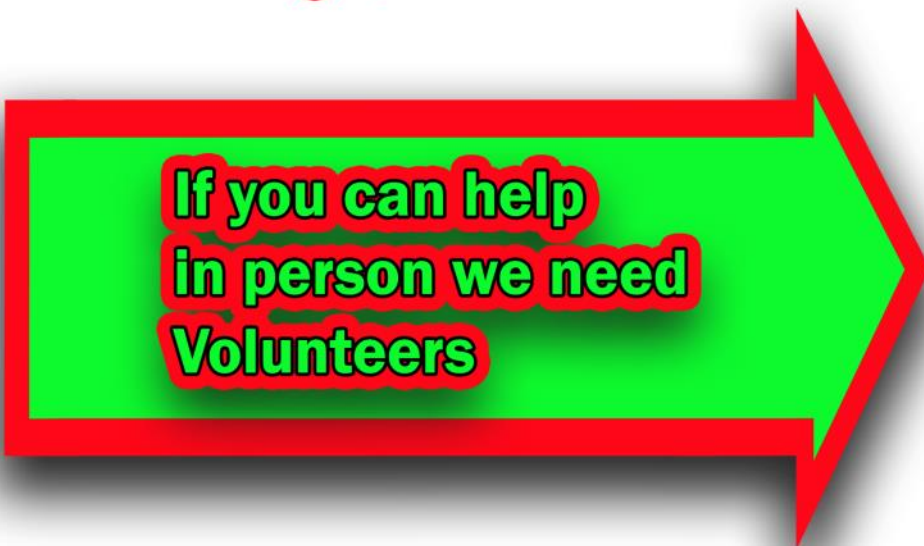

Ivermectin, Low-carb Diet, and Intermittent Fasting for Management of Alzheimer's Disease

To date there has been nothing transformative in the treatment of Alzheimer's disease. Many drugs have been tried, but overall there has been no demonstrable improvement.

Ivermectin was discovered by [Satoshi Ōmura](#) and William Campbell who isolated a compound from soil bacteria collected at a golf course in Japan. They were awarded the Nobel Prize in 2015 for their work. This is an inexpensive anti-parasitic drug which has very minimal side effects. It is now also being tried as supplemental [cancer treatment](#).



Studies using ivermectin for Alzheimer's disease in [animal models](#) showed improvements and indicated that human studies were needed. Isolated reports of humans using ivermectin in the treatment of Alzheimer's disease [report moderate success](#), previously not seen with other medications. They use rather small doses: 24 mg per day for 4-5 days. The improvements are relatively immediate and last for days.





These are not randomized trials but rather observational studies ([see YouTube](#)). The video deals with ivermectin's results combating cancer and Alzheimer's.

A [Ketogenic diet](#) is yet [another approach](#). Removing most carbohydrates from one's diet and replacing them with healthy saturated fats does two things: It reduces *glycation* of brain proteins and allows mitochondria to [switch from glucose to ketones](#) for energy. "Burning" glucose damages mitochondria, and this produces large quantities of oxidative radicals. Mitochondrial function is much improved when mitochondria "burn" ketones for energy. It's not that one will recover lost brain cells, but that the cells still remaining will have a significant boost of energy; this is reflected in [improved cognitive performance](#). And there is a real possibility that disease [progression will be arrested or slowed](#). [Where to get Ivermectin](#)? Check out [Amazon](#).

[Ketosis](#) is achieved not only by a ketogenic diet but also by [intermittent fasting](#) (18 hours fasting, 6 hours for consuming food). Trials are in progress using these methods not only for [Alzheimer's, but also for Parkinson's disease](#), other causes of cognitive impairment, Huntington's chorea, glioblastoma (a devastating brain cancer), depression, and several other neuropsychiatric disorders.

In conclusion: Ivermectin, a ketogenic diet, and intermittent fasting are just about the most benign and inexpensive methods for possibly managing Alzheimer's and [Parkinson's](#) diseases. None are (yet) approved by the medical establishment, and prospective double-blind studies are still in progress. Therefore, this is not medical advice, but rather an effort to educate and inform. This is well worth researching if any of your family members suffer from this incapacitating disease. And always consult your doctor.

Possible problems involve persuading caregivers to open and study the links shown above, getting patients to accept such interventions, and keeping the refrigerator empty of carbohydrates, sugary stuff, and fast foods. To preserve harmony at home, the caregiver may also have to switch to a ketogenic diet (which is not such a bad idea). Finding a doctor to oversee the project could be difficult. Many fear losing their medical licenses. Finally, it's not guaranteed to work.

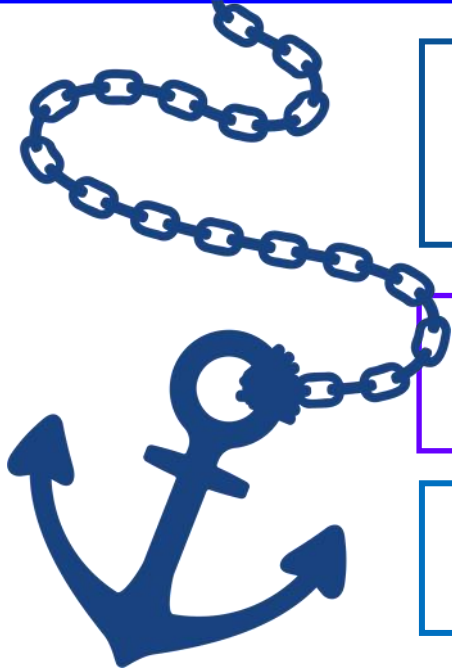

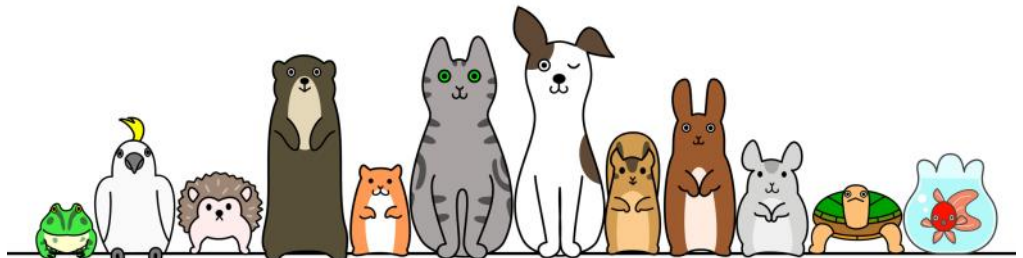
