When mariners started crossing the oceans, flags were an important communications tool between ships when at sea and even ashore. Lives depended on correct interpretation of their meaning, especially on fighting ships. Today, proper use of flags is not just a way to identify vessels and boating organizations, but to give important instructions, make announcements, warn of approaching storms, and mostly to honor and keep alive the naval traditions and seamanship spirit of those sailors who preceded us.

Flags have different shapes and colors, depending on their function. A pennant is a flag that is larger at the hoist than at the fly and can be triangular, tapering or swallow-tailed. A burgee is a pennant that identifies a recreational boating organization.



CIYC RACING REPORT By Cap'n Jane Thomas

RAMs and Racing Report, August 2023

On Saturday, July 8, VC Deborah (Larson) Tyhurst hosted the John Larson Memorial Race in honor of her father, John Larson, who loved sailing, rum, and Ruth Hatcher's chocolate chip cookies! Thankfully, Ruthie gave her cookie recipe to Deborah, and the racing skippers and crew enjoyed all of John's favorites! Seven boats entered – 2 non-spinnaker and 5 spinnaker

class – for the reverse-start race over a 12.8nm course. In non-spin SHE SAID NO (Precision 16, Ron Dietel, VSC) took 1st place, and EAU CLAIRE (Beneteau Oceanis 440, Rick and DeborahTyhurst, CIYC) took 2nd. In the spinnaker fleet CIRRUS (J/124, Bill Wood, Larry Listing, AYC) took 1st place, continuing their winning streak, and SO LONG (Ranger 26, Chris Hancock, VSC) took 2nd place single-handedly! CIYC boats took 3rd through 5th places: RISA (Catalina 38, Roxanne Vettese), RAMPANT 2 (Cal 9.2, Eric Taylor), and SWIFT (Hunter Legend 40.5, Jimmy Jewell), respectively.

Ventura Yacht Club hosted J/Fest the following weekend, July 15-16. The regatta was a qualifying race for boats hoping to be invited to the J/24 Nationals, and 15 boats participated. CIYC J/24 entries, TORTOISE (Shaun Plomteaux) and JEDI (Dan Maxwell/Gareth Jones), took 9th and 12th positions, respectively, after 8 races. Among the 7 entries in the J/70 regatta DJ (Ryan Cox, VYC) took 1st place.

The standard course for PBYC's Milt Ingram race is 42nm, but this year the forecast for July 22 was light and the Race Committee reduced the distance to 20nm. VELERO (Islander 29, Brent Swanson) was the only CIYC entry.

Yet to come in July are the Santa Barbara to King Harbor Race (July 28, 80nm) and PCYC's McNish Wooden Classic Yacht Race (July 29, 17nm). The wooden classics from far and wide have already started arriving in Channel Islands Harbor.

Congratulations to Mike Geer who moved up from his J/24 BANDALOOP to a Hobie 33 (OMG)!

On Wet Wednesdays there's now more competition for the A Fleet, and BAN-DALOOP is still raced in B Fleet – now by Fairwind YC members!

Creating A New Fun Park for Families and Kids To Enjoy at the Harbor

Making the harbor a more entertaining and fun place for families is key to revitalizing Channel Islands Harbor. Harbor Director Michael Tripp, working with a local experienced design team, has an exciting, visitor-friendly plan for Channel View Park (see photos). Their idea is to create a place where children can safely play while parents sit and enjoy a café latte from Honey Cup or take the kids for ice cream, a snack, or lunch at one of the harbor restaurants after they play.

Having more activity centers in the harbor benefits not only visitors but also harbor businesses and neighboring communities. It offers another reason for people to come to the harbor.

Personally, I am very excited about this plan. It is the first time that I can remember that the Harbor Department is actually doing something to create a real park playground with equipment, benches, and tables for families to use and enjoy. I hope the community expresses appreciation to the Harbor Director for another effort the Harbor Department is making to revitalize the harbor and its visitor-serving needs.

Oxnard Receives State Funding for Channel Islands Harbor Water Quality

Mayor John Zaragoza announced that the City of Oxnard will receive \$16.5 million in funding "to build and repair essential infrastructure that prioritizes the safety and wellbeing of our community." The Mayor credits the support of Assemblymember Steve Bennett, Assembly member

Cruising Corner by Dr. Garry G. Kraft

MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS-REFERRALS

Boats, like humans, need exercise, maintenance, and repairs.

I want to start an in-house referral program - whom do you use to fix your boat? Change the oil, etc.? I would like your feedback on companies and individuals that you've used to keep your boat running. If you have had extraordinary service, or disservice, let me know and we can propagate this information to the rest of our members.

Examples: Whom do you use for bottom cleaning? Boat wash/wax? Diesel and gas engine repairs, oil change and maintenance? Outboard engine repair and maintenance?

Who maintains your generator? Electrical systems? Favorite sailmaker and rigger? Who makes your canvas, bimini and dodger? Besides West Marine, where else to buy radar, GPS, depth sounder/fish finders and electronics?

Some boat maintenance tips for monthly, annually, and beyond:

Monthly boat maintenance checklist

- Wash the exterior: Scrubbing your boat will keep salt and dirt at bay and extend your gelcoat's life.
- Clean the interior: Clean your boat's interior by wiping down surfaces and scrubbing the head.
- Check the bilges: Check out bilges regularly to ensure they're dry.
- Run the engines: If you haven't run your boat in a month, let the engines run for 30 minutes.
- Check the fluid: Check your engine oil, transmission oil, and coolant levels.
- Pump out your waste tank: Schedule a pump-out service or do it yourself at least once a month.
- Check your boat's hull: To keep your boat's hull clean, hire a diver to scrub your hull every quarter.

Annual boat maintenance checklist

- Wax the gelcoat: Giving your boat a thorough waxing once a year will help maintain its shiny exterior and protect it from the sunshine and salt.
- Wash and waterproof canvas: Give your Biminis and covers a good wash down and reapply any waterproofing solutions or sprays once a year.
- Change the fluids: Change the engine oils, engine oil filters, and fuel filters once a year or every 100 hours of engine runtime.
- Clean out water tanks: To keep your potable water storage nice and fresh, plan on cleaning the tank to kill off any mold or mildew that may have built up over the last year.
- Service waste treatment systems: Whether you use storage tanks or an onboard sanitation system, it's wise to have these systems looked at annually.
- Request a vessel safety check: The U.S. Coast Guard offers free vessel safety checks for all boat owners.
 Schedule an in-person inspection or follow the online guide to doing it yourself.

Our next scheduled cruise is going to be fun!

August 11 - 13: Cruise to SBYC. This will be a boats, trains and automobiles adventure.

I will be requesting reservations for slips in the harbor (I think we have to have at least 6 boats confirmed) and also dinner one night (Friday? Saturday?) at Santa Barbara Yacht Club. I'll take my boat up Thursday, August 10, so I can be there to help you find your slip.

For those who don't have a boat, drive up and meet us for the SBYC dinner.

A great way to travel to Santa Barbara is the local Amtrak, a spectacular ride up the coast. Take the train, have dinner, maybe if another cruiser has room on his or her boat, spend the night, then take the train home the next day. The train leaves from Oxnard and Ventura, stops in Santa Barbara on State Street - a short walk or Uber to the Harbor.


