We will need help cooking dinner for the Billfish Tournament. Islanders will also be helping to serve at the catered dinner the following week.


The Holiday Season will soon be upon us and the Islanders have a lot to do.





Bioelectronics

An electrical stimulator of the heart, also known as a cardiac pacemaker, has been around for a long time. What a wonderful contraption! It can change the heart rhythm, depending on the demand for oxygen, it can shock the heart if it detects that the heart has stopped pumping, or if there is cardiac arrhythmia. Think of the millions of people whose lives have been made easier markable improvement. Dealing with the brain, howwith this electronic device.

The heart was the first logical step. Because it has its own electrical circuit, it was possible to correct its inadequacies. But, where do we go from here? Well, electrodes have been implanted in numerous places in the body, and some astonishing results have emerged.

For instance, in cases of hyper-reflexic bladder contractions, where the patient has numerous nightly trips to the bathroom, electrodes are inserted through nerve holes (foramina) in the sacrum, to the base of the bladder. Constant electrical stimulation significantly decreases the sense of urgency and the need for nightly bathroom visits. To the great relief of the patient and the spouse!

Electrical stimulation of the spinal cord is used in patients suffering from intractable and incapacitating pain. Electrodes are placed within the spinal canal, depending on where the pain is. The generating device, like the pacemaker, is implanted under the skin.

What about Crohn's disease? This is an incapacitating disease involving the large bowel. Symptoms are diarrhea, weakness, and tiredness. It is thought to be an overactive immune response. So someone figured out that the largest nerve in the body, the vagus nerve, could be influencing an inappropriate immune response. So why not regulate it? In the first patient, they implanted electrodes around the vagus nerve

and started the stimulation process. The results were astounding and resulted in a complete cure.

Another is Parkinson's disease. In some patients, although not all, implanting electrodes in the part of the brain responsible for the disease can produce reever, is a very complex issue, and the procedure is not always successful and can lead to complications.

Luigi Galvani was the first to observe that muscles stimulated by electricity will contract. This effect is put to use in rehabilitation therapy to produce muscle contractions in paralyzed or ambulatory patients with great limitations. But also, athletes may use the procedure to enhance the strength of their muscles before a competition. The electrodes are pasted to the skin and the electric current pulses and does the job of contracting the muscles. If you want to look like Superman, no need to go to the gym anymore.

The defibrillator (AED) is a marvelous electronic device that can evaluate if the heart is working, if there is rhythm irregularity, and if the patient needs to be shocked. It also guides by spoken prompts, step by step, what to do and how to operate the unit. Our club iust acquired a brand new unit which is located in the medical cabinet next to men's restroom. An oxygen tank is in the compartment below. I suggest that our members watch a YouTube demonstration of the procedure. https://youtu.be/msRft-g-k s (Click or copy and paste in your browser.) Thanks to Bill Scarpino, we've had several CPR demonstrations by qualified medics in our club with mannequins and defibrillator training devices. After Covid subsides, we

County Searches for New Harbor Director

The community expressed a lot of interest in understanding the type of candidate the County is seeking to replace Mark Sandoval, Harbor Director, who retired at the end of August.

The published job description also generated many comments.

The following were the most common questions and comments the County received

- We need a Harbor Director who is as passionate about the harbor as we (members of the community) are.
- Is this a good time to consider establishing a Harbor Commission that would bring a wide range of experience and expertise to the harbor?
- ◆ The ideal candidate should be familiar with this harbor and its market strengths.
- The job description should put more emphasis on experience in development and leasing strategies supporting visitor-serving and water recreational facilities.
- Who comprises the selection committee? Who will be interviewing the candidates?
- The candidate should have strong planning and innovation skills. Longterm planning capabilities are essential for updating the harbor's Public Works Plan that is the master plan for the harbor.
- If the harbor is to be categorized as an "enterprise," it is significantly important for the candidate to have skill sets to entice business and development to the harbor.
- The candidate must be able to maintain a viable network of collaborative relationships with the City of Oxnard, the local businesses, and the community to meet the mission goals of the harbor in keeping with visitor-serving and boating needs of the community.
- ◆ The candidate should have a proven track record of attracting, incentivizing, and working with local and other commercial businesses to establish and maintain visitor-serving businesses at the harbor.
- ◆ The candidate should have experience in obtaining grants for public amenities and improvement of parks and recreational facilities.
- ◆ Environmental justice is important to all public coastal recreational resources. The candidate should be a proponent of environmental justice, including maximum public access and public amenities.
- We hope the County will be patient in its search to find the right person to lead this harbor to fulfill its potential as one of, if not the best, of 12 small boat harbors along the California coast. The harbor is a rare and irreplaceable asset of the County and its residents.

In response to these comments, Michael Powers, the County CEO, said:

"The ideas (heard in the community) align very closely with the characteristics and skill sets we are seeking for a new Harbor Director as well. "

County Issues Second RFP for Parcel N-1, South of Public Boat Launch Ramp

As the County awaits responses to its first competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Whale's Tail (deadline is September 30, 2021), the County will issue its second RFP for parcel N-1 located at the corner of Victoria Avenue and Curlew Way, just south of the Public Boat Launch Ramp. The 2.9 acres of waterfront land and .9 acres of water area, include the 5,250 square foot marine chandlery/office building. The parcel is currently designated for Visitor-Serving Boating (VSB).

The public visioning process concluded that the most desirable developments for this area were:

- ♦ Destination "Floating on the Harbor" Restaurant with drive-up and tie-up for boats, as well as paddle-up access, on the waterside dock.
- Conversion of docks to locate floating hotel room rentals or "boatels."
- Visitor-serving commercial businesses, including cafés, shops, a pub. etc.
- ♦ Vintage trailer "glamping" (both rental and self-parking).
- Bed & Breakfast.

Note: These uses will require amending the harbor's PWP.

RFP says: "Weight will be given to proposals that are consistent with, and include, one or more of these uses, but proposals for uses other than those listed will be considered. At a minimum, the proposer should plan on rehabilitating the entire site, including parking, landscaping, public walkways, utilities, etc."


