

May 20th, 7pm, we will be having our General Meeting so please plan to attend that.





# Anglers' Corner

## White Sea Bass Grow-out Pen Report:

The WSB continue to thrive and grow. Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute (HSWRI) is contemplating having us keep the fish longer - perhaps into late June or early July to be sure we get maximum growth before we release them. The fish are now averaging 8.5 inches and 3.2oz.

Good news: A new study, four years in the making by a team of marine fisheries and geneticists, indicates that many more white seabass in California ocean waters emanate from the Hubbs-SeaWorld Research Institute (HSWRI) hatchery in Carlsbad, California, than previously thought.

Presented at the Aquaculture 2022 conference in early March in San Diego, California, the preliminary findings contrast sharply with a 2017 study that suggested less than 1 percent of white seabass caught in California were from the Carlsbad operation, known officially as the Ocean Resources Enhancement and Hatchery Program (OREHP). Researchers had based their previous findings on recovered coded wire tags that are routinely implanted in all juvenile white seabass at the hatchery. In the new study led by HSWRI and a research team at the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources, Ellen Reiber, a graduate student at the College of Charleston, used genetic markers recovered from tissue samples and archived otoliths (bones from the inner ears of white seabass) from hatchery brood stock and approximately 700 sub-legal-sized fish (less than 28 inches in length) captured from the Newport Beach, Oceanside, and San Diego coastal areas since the mid-1990s. A comparative analysis of the genetic markers found that 46.2 percent of the white seabass caught in these areas originated in the hatchery, as compared to only 7.4 percent of those fish having coded wire tags. \*\*

### Ivermectin as a Cancer-treating Drug (Unbelievable!)

Ivermectin (IVM) is an anti-parasitic that is widely used for the treatment of many parasitic diseases such as river blindness, elephantiasis, and scabies - and also to treat viral diseases, including Covid-19.

Satoshi Omura and William C. Campbell won the 2015 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for the discovery of ivermectin. Recently, scientists discovered that IVM has a strong anti-cancer effect.

**Kidney cancer** is the most aggressive type of urinary cancer and is highly resistant to current available therapies. The effects and mechanism of ivermectin in the treatment of kidney cancer demonstrate that it significantly inhibits proliferation and induces apoptosis (cell death) in multiple kidney cancer cell lines.

**Prostate cancer** is second in prevalence only to lung cancer among men in Western countries. It was found that ivermectin could enhance the activity of an anti-androgen drug in the prostate cancer cell line and reverse the resistance of the prostate cancer cell line to some other chemotherapies. Moreover, IVM was also found to have a good inhibitory effect on the prostate cancer itself.

**Leukemia** is a type of malignant disease caused by abnormal blood-forming stem cells. In an experiment, ivermectin in low concentrations preferentially killed leukemia cells without affecting normal blood-forming cells.

**Cervical cancer** is one of the most common gynecological malignancies, resulting in approximately 530,000 new cases and 270,000 deaths worldwide each year. The majority of cervical cancers are caused by human papilloma virus (HPV) infection. Ivermectin has been proven to significantly inhibit the proliferation and migration of malignant cells and to promote apoptosis (death of the cancer cells).

**Ovarian cancer** is a malignant cancer which lacks early clinical symptoms and has a poor therapeutic response. The 5-year survival rate after diagnosis is approximately 47%. A study found that ivermectin inhibited the proliferation of various ovarian cancer cell lines. Ivermectin could block the cell cycle and induce cell apoptosis. It also had a synergistic effect when combined with other drugs.

**Glioblastoma** is the deadliest brain cancer, with a median survival time of only 14-17 months. Experiments showed that ivermectin inhibited the proliferation of human glioblastoma cell lines in a dose-dependent manner and induced apoptosis. This was related to the induction of mitochondrial dysfunction and oxidative stress. Moreover, ivermectin could induce apoptosis of human brain microvascular endothelial cells and significantly inhibit new vessel growth - which is necessary to support tumor growth.

**Lung cancer** has the highest morbidity and mortality among cancers. It was found that ivermectin could significantly inhibit the proliferation of lung cancer cells and could reduce the metastasis of lung cancer cells.



Other cancers: In addition, favorable effects were seen in melanoma, as well as breast, nasal, pharyngeal, and liver cancers.

This research was done mainly in laboratories and we will see if this inexpensive drug will be further evaluated in real patients - or will the very expensive pharmaceuticals get priority and leave ivermectin for horses only. For more information, just type **ivermectin/cancer** in your browser.


# Channel Islands Harbor Watch

## **Quick Updates on Harbor Development News**

At the recent Channel Islands Neighborhood Council Meeting, Michael Tripp, the Harbor Director, provided the following updates on the harbor:

- A Request for Proposal (RFP) was reissued for the Whale's Tail facility and that they have received several calls regarding the property since reissuing the RFP and are hoping some result in proposal applications.
- The RFP for the N-1 Anacapa Boatyard parcel received one proposal. The project proposed is a lodging concept featuring 100+ container style units, a restaurant, a bar and spa facilities. The Australian Company involved is in the process of reviewing how best to respond to concerns raised by the California Coastal Commission regarding certain elements of their **Issues that Require Attention and Action** proposed project that may require changes and might impact the project's feasibility.
- At the meeting several attendees also raised concerns regarding the reduction in boatyard storage space. Michael Tripp indicated that this was also a concern of the Coastal Commission and that any reduction in boatyard space would require verification of the harbor's ability to provide reasonable and adequate dry dock boat storage space to service the boating community.
- Demolition of the old Casa Sirena Hotel and Lobster Trap restaurant should be completed by the end of May 2022. Revetment work around the Peninsula marina area would then start. Revetment work is estimated to take around 6 months, and once this work is completed, construction of the new hotel should begin.
- The Harbor Department, the Harbor & Beach Community Alliance, and the City of Oxnard have agreed to work together as grant co-applicants to improve the Channel View Park area. Proposed changes will be presented to the public and community for input.
- Other projects are: Harbor mouth dredging, Kiddie Beach Park and its surge wall, renovation of the Bahia and Safe Harbor marinas.



- The Harbor's volunteer Marine Advisory Committee has done an incredible job of water quality testing at the harbor for the past two years. The Committee is now seeking additional funding from the state to continue its water testing efforts at the harbor. Continuing to monitor and provide QAPP scientific data is essential to ensure the Water Board will investigate and enforce its regulations on entities that are not meeting required regulations on contaminants. The Committee also needs more volunteers and funds to support their water-testing efforts. Those interested in donating time and/or money should contact Chuck Carter at chuckcarter@vahoo.com.
- The election outcome of two County Supervisorial Districts this year could seriously impact the efforts the community has made to protect Channel Islands Harbor and other coastal resources. It is essential to know and support the candidates running in District 2 (Linda Parks is termed out) and District 4 (Bob Huber is not seeking re-election) who will provide the third vote to ensure the harbor is developed appropriately, its water quality is maintained, and oil drilling is not allowed to expand and pollute the beaches and County neighborhoods.




### **That Irish Spirit**


