

WATER

Oxnard's Decision on Fisherman's Wharf Project's Local Coastal Plan Amendment Will Impact Entire Harbor

On July 18th, the City of Oxnard will hold a second public meeting on an application for a Local Coastal Plan Amendment (LCPA) from Ventura County and developer, Channel Islands Harbor Properties LLC (CIHP). This will be the second of 3 public meetings on this issue. Public comments are welcome at this meeting.

The July 18th meeting is with the City's Planning Commissioners. The time and location of this meeting were not determined as of this writing. The third public meeting will be with the City Council and is anticipated for mid- to late September 2019.

Amending its Local Coastal Plan is a serious decision for the City. This amendment will impact the entire harbor, not just Fisherman's Wharf. It will allow other high-density residential development at the harbor. The City will lose its permitting authority and be unable to propose any modifications or changes to harbor development projects, despite the fact they are within the City.

This amendment is critical for the massive apartment complex project to go forward to a California Coastal Commission hearing. The California Coastal Commission (CCC) has required that this be done. Without this LCPA, the project will be suspended.

Those interested in the outcome of this Local Coastal Plan Amendment decision should attend the July 18th meeting and voice their concerns.

Updates on Other Harbor Matters

Actual Scale Model of Fisherman's Wharf Project Built Using Developer's Plans and Elevations

The grassroots volunteer community group, the Harbor & Beach Community Alliance (HBCA), has built a scale model of the Fisherman's Wharf project using the developer's own plans and elevations.

The model was built to educate the public. It shows what the project really looks like in stark contrast to the developer's promotional renderings.

The model has been shown at several community meetings and at a California Coastal Commission hearing as an example of why good decisions about development projects can only be made if there are accurate representations of a project. Promotional renderings are designed to "sell" a project and there are no consequences to the developer if they are misleading. This is not right and is unfair to the public. Continue next page..





Hyatt Place Hotel Project - More Delays

At the June 6th Harbor Academy presentation, the Harbor Director announced that the replacement for the old Casa Sirena Hotel and restaurant faces further delays. The following is a timeline of events.

2016

March 22, 2016 – Hotel project approved by County Board of Supervisors for parcels F and F-1

<u>May 3, 2016</u> – Board of Supervisors approves reinstating an expired Exclusive Right to Negotiate (ERN) to Fisherman's Wharf developer, Channel Islands Harbor Properties LLC. This ERN had expired more than a year before, in February 2015. This ERN was for the same parcels, F and F-1, which had been awarded to the Hotel Project a month earlier. The community was stunned and furious.

June 9, 2016 – California Coastal Commission approves Public Works Plan Amendment 6 for Hotel.

2018

<u>June 8, 2018</u> – California Coastal Commission approves the Notice of Impending Development (NOID) for Hotel to start demolition and construction.

2019

January 2019 – County tries to get Oxnard street land for Hotel parking and announces rock revetment work is a bigger project than originally anticipated.

Harbor Director says it is anticipated that we will be ready for demolition (of old Hotel) in May...then the revetment work could occur, which could take up to six months.

<u>April 2019</u> – Harbor Director says old Hotel demolition is delayed and now expected to start in October and is expected to take four months.

Based upon the Harbor Department's current projected timetable, the anticipated date for hotel construction to start will be sometime around July-August of 2020. Interestingly, Channel Islands Harbor Properties' (CIHP) exclusive development right for this site expires on June 30, 2020.

Whale's Tail – Still No Agreement with Fresca II.

There has been an ongoing series of missed dates for an agreement to go before the Ventura County Board of Supervisors. The Whale's Tail has been vacant since December 2015. The selection of Fresca II was announced in July 2017.

Channel Islands Boating Center – Still No Operating Agreement Since It Was Built in April 2013 for \$8 Million and is Not Operating Full-Time.
