

HISTORIAN

Beverly Hamilton

On Labor Day weekend in 1978 Jimmy Donlon, Ginger Yantz, Walter and Ellie Bishop, Bob Hamilton and myself took off for a four day cruise of fishing and relaxation around the Channel Islands in Jim's 34 ft. motorboat, PESCADOR.

We left Oxnard and headed toward the inland side of the islands. We cruised by Arch Rock (beautiful as ever), and on to Santa Cruz Island. We passed many great anchorages such as Scorpion, Potato, Prisoners, Pelican and Frys. On the first day out, Walter caught a 55 lb. White Sea Bass. Now what can you do with that huge fish on day one of four days? Well, we couldn't keep it, but had a couple of meals from it.

In those days, the fishing was great, as the pictures will attest to.

The Painted Cave is a wondrous sight. It is not an anchorage but a fascinating spot to tie off and visit by dinghy, which we did. The walls of the cave are about 80 ft. high. Magnificent greens, yellows and reds can be seen on the walls by flashlight as you row into the cave. Jimmy, Ginger and Ellie took the dinghy into the cave. The rest of us waited on the boat. They were gone quite awhile, when suddenly the seals who inhabit the cave came rushing out, behind them came the dinghy with Ellie and Ginger singing at the top of their lungs. Poor seals were scared to death!

We continued on past Santa Rosa Island, fishing and enjoying the views of the lovely island. San Miguel Island is the most remote, being only 7.6 miles long. It is desolate and windy so we headed for Cuyler Harbor. There is a little rock in the middle of the harbor named Prince Rock. It was low tide so Ginger and I took the dinghy and went exploring. When we got there, the rock was covered with large mussels. We gathered as many as we could stuffing our shirts, pockets, shoes, socks and went back to the boat. Jim and Bob were delighted, but Walt and Ellie weren't very excited. We found out that Commodore John Bamford, Arlene, his lawyer and wife were in the area, and were invited to dinner. Walter decided to "dress for dinner" and wore a pink dress shirt, purple tie, and cufflinks. The mussels

were steamed, butter was drawn and Jim, Ginger, Bob and I ate with much delight. The others just watched. After awhile John Bamford said "well, they're not dead yet" and joined us in the special treat.

The next day we proceeded around the end of San Miguel to head back on the outer side of the islands. It was terribly rough, but Jim was getting low on bait. He contacted the RANGER, a huge commercial fishing boat. They came and attempted to give us a scoop of bait. Well, that was a trick! With the rough seas, first the RANGER was way above us, and then the PESCADOR towered above them. I was under the covers in the bow berth until it was over. Anyway we got the scoop, so the fishing continued the rest of the trip.



On Santa Rosa island we passed the shipwreck of the S.S. Chickasaw near Johnson's Lee, and also saw the elephant seals lounging on the beach. We stopped at Forney's Cove at Santa Cruz Island.. It was difficult to get into the cove, but once there, it was very calm and beautiful.



From there are other anchorages, Willows, Coches Prietos, Alberts and on up to Yellowbanks and Smugglers. Then around Anacapa Island and home.

This article isn't really history, but gives you an outline if you ever want to circumnavigate the Islands. They all are beautiful in their own way and most fascinating. I hope you enjoyed our own little "history".
