

<u>DAV Sail Day (June 26)</u> – I need someone to lead this effort and attend all meetings to represent the Islanders and organize our contribution to this great event.



Anglers' Corner - April 2016

Fishing Report:

Rock Fish season is in full swing and there are reports of avery good Yellow Tail bite at Anacapa Island, most of the fish caught on the fast retrieved surface irons.

WSB Grow-out Pen Update:

The pen is still empty. Don Dickey and Mark Banda dove on the Predator net. They found two relatively large holes in the very bottom of the net and repaired them. While there, they cleaned more mussels from the net.

The large holes would have been accessible at the highest tides and that coincides with the incursions we had earlier. We don't know for sure if the sea lions were the cause of the hole or not, so we don't know if they will once again chew or otherwise tear open the net. HSWRI divers inspected the pens and we can expect fish the beginning of May.

New Anglers Award:

We are considering having a **"First Marlin of the Year"** Flag this year. The Flag will be awarded to the CIYC boat and Crew that catches and releases the first LOCAL Marlin of the year. The Skipper of the Boat must be a CIYC Anglers' Club member. The fish would have to be caught and released south of Latitude 34 deg. 35 min. (Point Arguello), north of Latitude 33 deg. 40 min. (3.5nm south of the 17 fathom spot) and east of Longitude 121 deg. 06 min (the Rodriguez Seamount), verified with a photo of the release and a photo of the GPS onboard. If enough crews want to participate, we may also have a pool for a prize. Let me know what you think.

Anglers' Club Rules for Big Fish of the Month (\$50 Prize)

- 1. Fish must be caught within 100 miles of Channel Islands Harbor
- 2. Marlin, Sharks and Rays are not to be considered as winners
- 3. Must be caught on rod and reel
- 4. Fish can be verified by any CIYC member
- 5. Fisherperson must be a paid CIYC Anglers' Club member
- 6. Angler must bring the fish to the boat, but can have help gaffing or netting
- 7. CIYC, PCYC or Channel Islands Sportfishing scales can be used, others if certified.
- 8. Tournament fish do not count except for the Big Fish of the Year
- 9. An angler can only win the Big Fish of the Month one time a year
- 10. At the yearly Anglers Awards dinner, the Big Fish of the Year is awarded \$100. It does not have to be a fish submitted as a Big Fish of the Month to qualify. So keep fishing!!!

Let's Poke Some Fun

We all know about colonoscopies. For people 50 - 85 years of age, and without known risk factors, colonoscopy is recommended once every 10 yrs. There are two types of colonoscopies, but both, unfortunately, require thorough bowel cleansing. Probably this is the aspect of these procedures that causes the most discomfort.

The regular colonoscopy involves insertion of a flexible fiber-optic instrument, which a gastroenterologist, under visual control, guides through the nooks and crannies of the large bowel, all the way to the appendix. The doc is looking for signs of cancer and polyps. Polyps are precancerous thingies that look like a little ball on a stalk. Even tiny ones are removed, then and there, and sent to pathology for testing. The procedure can be done with "twilight sleep" or heavier sedation, as it may be quite uncomfortable without some level of sedation or anesthesia. Sometimes, the colon is too twisty, so that the examiner can't take a peek into the part that's farthest away. In this eventuality the physician will want you to have a virtual colonoscopy.

The virtual colonoscopy (also known as colonography) involves CT imaging. After the bowel prep, which additionally involves drinking some contrast material (which looks white on CT), lots of air (which looks black on CT) is inserted into the colon via a small rectal tube. The air inflates and distends the colon, so that any polyp is easily detected. The problem, of course, is that if such a polyp is detected, then one needs a regular colonoscopy to remove the polyp and send it to pathology.

About 33% of the population is non-compliant with these recommendations. This puts these people at increased risk of developing inoperable colon cancer.

So what else is out there?

The Cologuard Test is the newest test, approved by the FDA about two years ago. This test checks for occult blood in the stool, abnormal DNA, and methylation changes, and it can be done at home. The detection rate for cancers is 92%, and for precancerous polyps, 46%. The test is considered to be an adjunct to colonoscopy, but may be preferred by the chickens among us who absolutely refuse to be poked.

Last year, some 140,000 new colorectal cancers were diagnosed in the US. Some 50,000 people died from the disease. Always talk to your doctor.

Having recently undergone a colonoscopy, I would add that you should consider your bathroom your best friend as you go through the prep! While it's no fun doing the prep and getting poked in the ass, it's a great relief to wake from sedation and know it's all done. YAY! Best of all, to take preventive action when it comes to cancers! (Erika)

She fell in love with the area and decided to stay. She worked for the Chamber of Commerce and later was a receptionist for Raytheon. She joined our Yacht Club sometime after that. She was called "Monki" by her Friends and Brother. It was a nickname her husband had given her.

Iris passed away on July 12, 1982. It was a great loss for those of us who knew her at CIYC, especially her best friends, Sarah Roberts and former members Jo Bell and Dorie Tofft. Sarah, Dorie and Iris set the tables for Saturday Night Dinners .They always had great fun doing it. (That was back in the days when we used paper tablecloths, plates and napkins.)

Brierley and his wife, Jenny, gave \$500 to her friends for a Memorial and from this came the oval stained-glass with our Burgee and an "Iris" flower in the corner. The art work was designed by Sarah Roberts. Brierley also donated \$1000 in Iris's memory for a Sabot for the young people to use, which was named "Munki Fun". Iris was always remembered by her friends for her happy smile, her love of flowers and her beautiful singing voice.

The Cannon Trophy in the bookcase was hand made by past member, David Sheehan, who then donated it to our Club.

Through the years, we were and are still very fortunate to have so many generous giving members.
