

In celebration, we will be holding a "CIYC Dock Party and BBQ"- with lots of food- libations and music. This will be a great time to introduce your boating friends to the Club.

The Club has enjoyed 6 Cruises thus far, all having been very well attended. CIYC has hosted the Mid Winters Regatta, Port Royal Regatta, Bob Cooke Memorial Regatta, Opening Day Parade, Lady at the Helm Race, Newport to Ensenada Race, and the CI to MDR race so far this year.

We are currently attracting new members every month, and our RAM participation is on the rise. In retrospect, we have had a very busy and successful 6 months.





As you can see, the team cleaned up. We took first place in the three classes that we entered and

again we had more boats take part than any other club, except the hosts, Pierpont Bay Y.C.

As usual, this race, the first of the Landrover Series, was a long affair, with several boats finishing in the early hours of Sunday morning. We won't pick out any special boats as this was the best team effort that CIYC has put together in a long time and everybody concerned deserves our thanks and congratulations.

#### **Anacapa To Port**

On June 2nd the action moved to Anacapa Y.C. with the first of the Island series, Anacapa to port. This infamous race always promises to be long with very little wind on the back side of the island.

The race started with worryingly light winds, generally the precursor to a long day on the water. Away first in Spin A were *Deception*, the Santa Cruz 50 with *Perfect Balance* the Olson 30. Light winds gave these two boats the early advantage. Rod Abbott in *Funatic* managed to slowly haul in the Olson, so the order of battle on reaching the island was *Deception*, *Funatic*, *Perfect Balance*, *Three Little Birds*, *Coyote*, *No Compromise* and *Leona Kai*.

Meanwhile the non spin boats with *Velero* in the van, slowly ground out the miles towards the island. They were quickly overtaken by the big cat *Afterburner* and the trimaran *Indefatigable*.

The surprise came at the turn around the west end. There was wind. Not much 'tis true, but enough to keep people moving. The whole field bunched together but all moved around the "Windward Mark" with more speed than they had dared hope.

Another surprise at the east end, the wind

was on the beam and up went the spinnakers, one after the other as we all romped home. The non-spin boats had a great reach all the way home, the last one finishing well before sunset.

Perfect Balance won Spin A with Coyote  $2^{nd}$  and Funatic  $3^{rd}$ . The non spin was won by our Velero with Mike Taylor on Harmony  $2^{nd}$ .

### **Bob Cooke Memorial Double Handed Series**

The closer of this fascinating series was held on June 9<sup>th</sup>. All good things must come to an end and 13 boats turned out on a beautiful day to be on the water, in memory of a man who truly loved our sport.

Most boats wanted to see more wind, but the Olsons and the J24s were enjoying the feeling of being far too close to the big boats. The spinnaker boats went the traditional route, around Anacapa, however Dan Alpern kindly sent us the starboard route as there is generally more apparent wind that way. Well done Dan.

West Wing and Funatic found it difficult to get traction in these conditions and had a small lead over Perfect Balance, Bikini Machine and XS at Arch Rock. Then followed the frantic hunt for wind, as boats darted in all directions looking for the merest puff to gain an advantage. At the end of this 5 mile beat, the picture had completely changed. First, around the West end and back into the channel was Perfect Balance, followed by Funatic, West Wing, Bikini Machine and XS. The slower J24's had not been idle and were still in sight at the turn. The wind was forward of the beam, but most set spinnakers to speed their way home.



First to finish was *Funatic*, followed by *Perfect Balance, XS and West Wing*. However on corrected time, *Jaded*, sailed by Deke Klatt the first J24 home by 22 minutes, won the race followed by *Perfect Balance, Bikini Machine and Radio Flyer*.

In the series, *Bikini Machine*, sailed by Avery Stewert of Ventura Y.C. was first, *Perfect Balance* was 2<sup>nd</sup> followed by *Jaded*, *Angry Hillbillies*, *XS*, *Quiet Thing Two* and *West Wing*.

In the non-spin class, *Velero* romped home again (maybe he's getting help from upstairs) ahead of *Zuma Jay*, *Harmony* and *Runaway*. But in the series *Velero* was 1<sup>st</sup> with 5 points, *Runaway* 2<sup>nd</sup> with 7, *Harmony* 3<sup>rd</sup> with 9 and *Zuma Jay* with 10 points, only because Kevin Dickmann was not able to enter the middle race. Well done all, with a great turnout for the club and Bob.
