VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS

The Vessel Safety Check is a complimentary check of your boat conducted by members of the Auxiliary, confirming that it meets both federal and state requirements for safety. No citations are issued and the results of the safety check are not reported to any enforcement agency, but a decal is awarded to display if the vessel has passed the examination.

An example of some of the items checked include:

- Personal Flotation Devices (life jackets)
- Registration and numbering
- Navigation lights
- Ventilation
- Fire extinguishers
- Distress signals (flares, horn, etc.)
- Battery cover and connections

All of these items are currently required by state and federal laws and, if missing or non-operating, can result in a citation if your vessel is inspected by the Coast Guard.

The Vessel Safety Check gives you a risk-free way to check that you meet the legal minimums and to potentially avoid a citation later.





Competitive Edge Richard Sharpe



I must apologize for the lack of a Competitive Edge article in August. I am afraid that there was too much preparation for the Olson 30 National Championships in July and I missed the deadline.

That brings me neatly to the subject of the event and I, as president of the Olson 30 Class Association want to thank Frank Sullivan and Larry Golkin for the fantastic job their team did in making this the best Olson regatta in years. The club should pat itself on the proverbial back for a task well done.

Wet Wednesdays

You know, some people take this sail boat racing lark far too seriously! O.K., Richard Sharpe (whose mother dropped him on his head when he was a baby) has an excuse, but some of the others are just over the top.

But it doesn't have to be that way for all of you who like to be competitive, but also want to have some fun. That is where Wet Wednesdays come in. The pace is a little less frenetic and there is time to learn tips about boat handling, and at the same time, brushing up your BBQ skills.

The Wet Wednesday season is half way through and CIYC boats are prominent in two classes. Funatic, Perfect Balance and Maine Squeeze are all doing their bit in spinnaker A. With Funatic and Perfect Balance battling it out for first place overall.

In non spinnaker, the charge is ably led by Harry Krum on Fusee who, to howls of anguish from his competitors, keeps racking up win after win. Shoestring (Doug Brown) is also winning and Sisu (Tim Haappanen) along with Zoarces (Shelly Johnson), Zuma Jay (Kevin Dickmann), Twelfth Night (Ed Calo) Advocate (Ron Jackson) are all in contention for top places. I know that our Vice Commodore is enjoying the Wednesday night format hugely as he turns out most weeks on board Fusee. Boats are always looking for crew, so call Dan Alpern or Richard Sharpe and they will try to get you hooked up with a ride. You won't regret it.

Platform A

This race is a test of character for most competitors. It is a beat of 20.5 miles to platform A and a 20.5 mile spinnaker run back. It is not pretty, but it is part of the Anacapa YC Island series and if you want to do well in the series, then platform A oil rig features in your plans.

Mercifully, there was wind on the day and all boats set out dreading that the wind wouldn't hold, but it did and the two Olson 30, The Source and Perfect Balance, chased Funatic to the rig and back again. The Source managed a rare win over Perfect Balance, who came second then Funatic 3rd. In non spinnaker Zuma Jay had less wind for the last part of the race and came in second behind the much quicker R-Escape.

Milt Ingram Trophy

42 miles is a long way by sail boat and it gets even longer if the wind does not cooperate. This year's running of the Milt Ingram race was highly unusual and the wind conditions were nowhere near typical. After a normal start, in winds of 6 to 8 knots, the wind completely shut off in mid channel, just short of the oil rigs. The one boat that should have made the most of these conditions, had some stubborn kelp issues and was well down the pack. Perfect Balance was becalmed like everybody else, but began to pick up the pace after a desperate skipper "flossed" the boat with a spare sheet.



Up until the wind died, our own Mike Warns in 5150 was doing well, but a crewmember stepped into an open hatchway and suffered what looked like serious injury, therefore Mike abandoned the race to get his crewmember to hospital. Fortunately it turned out that the suspected broken ribs were only badly bruised.

The wind eventually filled in and enabled a reasonably fast return to Ventura. 5150's retirement left the spinnaker A field open and Deception managed to beat Prevail to Ventura Harbor to take first place. In spinnaker B an unlikely winner was P.K. Edwards in his Catalina 42 Wind Dancer who was able to make the most of the long reach back to the harbor. Our Perfect Balance was 3rd with Funatic 4th Maine Squeeze helmed by Cherrie Taylor was 7th.

Non spinnaker held much gold for CIYC and Dennis West in West Wing took first place in Class D, with Larry and Jo-Ann Hansen in Scooter 2nd, Shelly Johnson in Zoarces was 5th. Non spinnaker E class went to Brent Swanson in Velero.

Anacapa Island Series

The final race of this challenging series took place on Saturday 9th August and series leader Perfect Balance was without a helm or a crew. Dan Alpern stepped into the breach and even though he was leading a crew that had never sailed together, he managed to get 4th place in a race that is always in 3 parts; the trip around Gina on the way to the island. The back side of Anacapa and the spinnaker reach back to the harbor.

The race was dominated by a boat that has never been raced in spinnaker class before. Wainui a Cal 48 skippered by Mark Coleman (with Harry Crum skippering) stuck like glue to Funatic and corrected out over the fleet with a minute to spare over Funatic. Maine Squeeze was fifth.

In the non spinnaker class, Velero was again too quick for Zuma Jay and Joss. Well done again Brent.

Series Results

In the Spinnaker A series Perfect Balance was first with Funatic second, Maine Squeeze was fifth. Spinnaker B was Angry Hillbillies II and in non spinnaker Zuma Jay was first with Zoarces 2nd. Well done CIYC.

Neil Underwood Memorial Regatta

Several local yachtsmen take part in this event solely because of the memories they have of competing against Neil Underwood in the past. Saturday 16th August was a picture perfect day with calm seas and light winds for the eight boats taking part in this year's regatta. However, picture perfect doesn't always mean good racing conditions.

In the spinnaker class, the four races were grueling with the light wind offering up huge shifts on the way to the weather mark and tacking angles of 120 degrees, just to confuse the helms. All boats suffered at one time or another and several different boats finished races in first place.

With 7 points Perfect Balance came out the winner (two wins, a second and a third) with Stan Whisenhunt in his J24 Tortoise a close second, and John Thawley's XS in third place. Our own Mike Taylor on Maine Squeeze was fifth. (Maybe half his crew was thinking of Wild Bill's birthday bash to be held at the club later in the evening!)


In the non spin class Shelly Johnson raced his Zoarces hard in conditions that are certainly not suitable for a heavy boat, Velero (Brent Johnson) couldn't make progress either and they were both led home by Tijuana Taxi form Pierpont Bay YC helmed by Paul Morre. This light boat, only 21 feet long had all the advantages on a course as challenging as this.

Perfect Balance and Tijuana Taxi's names will go on the perpetual trophy.



ATTENTION MARINERS

Between September 15, 2008, and January 16, 2009, the hydraulic dredge "H.R. Morris" will be staging and conducting maintenance dredging of the Channel Islands Harbor entrance on a 24-hour basis. The dredging activity will be taking place in various locations in and around the harbor entrance and sand trap area. The various locations may require changing buoy systems and dredge pipe configurations using support equipment on Silver Strand and Hollywood beaches. Vessel navigation and pedestrian activity near the dredging operation is inherently dangerous. Mariners must exercise all due caution and prudence when navigating in these areas. Provided below is a diagram illustrating the various lights and shapes that will be encountered by vessels navigating in these areas. THE SOUND SIGNAL FOR DANGER IS FIVE SHORT BLASTS.



At all times, vessels navigating near the dredge operations or support vessels must adhere to the United States Coast Guard "Rules of the Road". Rule #34 states "All vessels in a meeting, crossing or overtaking situation, must signal their intent and obtain passing instructions by sound or by radio telephone". Call dredge "H.R. Morris" on VHF channel 16. Vessel speed while navigating near dredging operations must not exceed FIVE MILES PER HOUR. Please contact the Channel Islands Harbor Patrol at 805-382-3007 if you have any questions or concerns.
