## Angler's Corner Frank Sullivan

I attended the meeting in Irvine with Hubbs Research and got more information on the new use of our WSB grow-out pens. Hubbs Research is planning to hold adult White Sea bass in the Channel Islands pen this year, as part of their brood stock collecting efforts. They want to maintain a total of 200 brood stock, they currently have 165 and many are getting too old and too big for the facility. They also wish to diversify the genetic sources of the WSB fry. To this end they are planning on replacing 50 of the older fish every year with new wild ones to continue the program.

Hubbs is in contact with Steve Kelly on the Island Tak and Joe Villarreal of the Mirage, a couple of local sport fishing boats that are willing to help collect live animals for our pen. The Island Tak is confirmed and the Mirage is probable. We will need to install one of the containment nets by April 10<sup>th</sup> so they can begin the process.

Michele Dilldine, CIYC member and owner of the Anacapa Dive service, had two of her divers, over two days, clean the bottom of the pen floats and the predator net. She did this as a donation to the program. If you see her please show your appreciation.

## **HISTORIAN - Bud Gerding**

As I Remember---Cruiser Navigation

Historian

The **first Cruiser Navigation contest of the year** is scheduled for April. Here is some limited information in case some members are not familiar with this event.

Cruiser Navigation is a boating contest designed to test the nautical skills of a boat, skipper and crew and knowledge of the sea. This is basically a powerboat function but could also be participated in by a sail boat under power. One description [dated 1986] of the type of boat required to enter the races is as follows; "First of all a boat must be at least 19 feet long, have an inboard engine, two bunks, an ice box, a head and a stove." This description would to fit many boats, sail or power.

A Cruiser Navigation contest is conducted over a course of several legs laid out on the water with turning points, at the end of each leg, as identified by latitude and longitude points as well as other known fixed points, such as an oil rig.

The Skipper calculates the amount of time required to run each leg of the course considering sea conditions, wind, speed of the boat an other intangibles of the day. The object of the contest is to determine how close the Skippers predicted times compare to actual times required to complete each leg of the entire course. The differences between predicted times and actual times are then calculated to determine the boat with smallest error between the two times to determine the winner. Each boat must have an observer on board to observe the actual times required for each leg of the course. The observer is an integral part of the over all contest

Cruiser Navigation competitions are against other Yacht Clubs as well as other boats within CIYC. Local Yacht Clubs sponsor several races over the season, which includes a series of races. To determine the overall winner, the winner must win a majority of these races

Cruiser Navigation was originally named Predicted Log Race; the name was changed as some Insurance Companies thought this sounded something like drag racing. Cruiser Navigation is probably a better name as to negotiate several legs against a time clock can make these races a tough navigation problem considering vagaries of wind and sea.

The forerunner of the Predicted Log Races were held over distances such as Santa Barbara to Channel Islands Harbor, Catalina to Channel Islands Harbor and others. Currently the Races are held in the Channel Islands Channel.

This is a very interesting club event and should be experienced by as many members as possible. Check it out and have some fun.
