





Well, here it is fall. Our boating activities are winding down and it is time for some fun.

An open letter to the Members from an Epicurean:

Having now crewed on a few Saturday-night dinners, I have learned that we Epicureans are a diverse group of women. Most of us love to cook, some of us like to serve, we all love a good party, and don't mind volunteering to help make one happen. We are homemakers, retirees, office managers, medical workers, project managers, and a host of other occupations.

But one thing I can tell you that we all have in common: none of us are food-service workers or restaurant owners. Given that, I am continually impressed that we are able to pull off these dinners as well as we do. Many of us have never cooked for this many people before, or worked in an industrial-sized kitchen. And yet we have had some pretty sensational culinary successes, have we not? Those of us who work to put these events on are always thrilled by the satisfied smiles and delighted accolades we receive from our fellow club members.

Which is why it can be so startling when someone treats us poorly.

Putting on one of these dinners is no easy feat. Menus must be planned, recipes converted, shopping done. We will often start cooking a day or more in advance. On the day of the event, the core crew will usually begin early in the morning, preparing the ingredients and devising crew assignments. The rest of the crew will arrive mid-afternoon – and from that point on it's a veritable frenzy of chopping, mixing, boiling, sautéing, baking, roasting and stirring. Once the bell rings, the next rush begins – transporting the food upstairs using the temperamental dumbwaiter, plating, serving, and clearing. We generally don't even get to eat – by the time we can sit down, we're often so sick of looking at this food that we wouldn't want to anyway. Besides, when we're on an Epicurean crew, it is our pleasure to ensure that everyone is happy.

However, no matter how hard we try, it's simply impossible to please everyone. We know that, and accept it. But complaints about the menu ("What? You're not serving chicken?"), or snarky comments ("I can't believe I paid twenty dollars for this!") are not exactly helpful. Nor do they inspire us to want to continue to volunteer our time.

And it's not just at Epicurean events. The crew at a recent club event found themselves short-handed, leading to long lines and unsliced rolls. But instead of offering to help (or, gosh-darn-it, slicing their rolls themselves!), people stood and complained. Out loud.

Perhaps some members need to be reminded that this is a club that thrives on the enthusiasm, involvement, and volunteer spirit of its members. Without those of us willing to give of ourselves, we wouldn't have Saturday night Epicurean dinners...or a club at all, for that matter.


Fortunately, these unpleasant moments have been relatively rare. I know that the vast majority of our members love our club, and go out of their way to express appreciation for the volunteers. Still, I'd like to make a few suggestions:


- 1. Before signing up for a dinner, check the menu. Whatever's on there that's what's being served. If you don't like ribs, it's probably not a good idea to come to a "bbq ribs dinner".
- 2. The servers do their best to serve equitably, but sometimes a plate might get shortchanged. If you're not happy with what's on your plate, feel free to bring it back and it'll be replaced. If you do it with a smile, you'll probably get a smile back. In fact, PLEASE do it with a smile.
- 3. If you can see the crew at an event is short-handed, and you're not particularly busy...feel free to pitch in and
- 4. Please remember that these are not paid restaurant workers. They're members just like you and they're working to make your club a fun place to go. Please appreciate them.

I'm a relatively new member – less than two years – and I have written this from my own perspective. On the whole I have found this club to be very welcoming, and full of fun-loving people who share our love of the sea. I wish to offer my personal thanks to all of the members who give their time and work so hard to make our club great.
