Message From The Commodore **Frank Sullivan**

October 24th was the date for the Annual General meeting and election of the Bridge. I'm pleased to announce that next year your Commodore will be Larry Golkin, Vice Commodore will be Mary Foster and Rear Commodore will be Georgie Olsen. All were selected by unanimous vote of the members present. I have every confidence that these folks will serve you in an exemplary manner next year. They have worked tirelessly for the last year on the board in your interests and I'm sure they will continue to do so.

The called meeting for the dues increase was well attended and the membership came up with a very workable compromise on dues for next year. First the preferred alternative was negotiated then the membership voted on whether to accept the dues change or not. These changes were approved by an overwhelming majority of the voting members present at the Called Meeting:

The Annual dues for Regular members will increase from \$650 a year to \$900 a year. Ram, Inactive and Yachting member's dues will increase from \$130 a year to \$180 a year. This should help to slow or eliminate the erosion of our cash assets.

To help increase participation and stabilize income there will be a \$50 a month prepaid "use it or lose it" fee charged to all Regular, Ram, Lifetime and Yachting members. The fee can be used over a 3 month period for any purchase at the club. This must be paid within the first week of each month or may be paid quarterly or yearly in advance. Payment may be made by check, cash, credit card or automatic draft from a credit card account or checking account. The unspent portion of the \$50 not used with in the 3 month period will be surrendered to the club. To implement this program the Clubs cash register system will be upgraded and charges will be tracked by member number in the accounting system.

This was a difficult decision and I thank the members for understanding the need for this inconvenient dues increase and the members of the board for working so hard on this.

The dinning room will be closed for most of the month of November while the room renovations are underway. Thank you to R/C Mary Foster and the members of the design committee for all your hard work.

Now the time has come we will start November 2nd please come out and help:





A past old member of our club, **Virginia Gilford** recently passed away. Please keep her family in your thoughts.



The Big Fish for August was caught by Marshall Lambert. He was fishing at anchor in Coches Prieto Anchorage during the Club Cruise August 29-31. He landed the fish after an extensive fight on heavy tackle. I was anchored near by and Marshall hauled the fish over to the Valkyrie where it was hoisted aboard and admired. Since no other fish was turned in as the Big Fish of the month by a CIYC Anglers member, this fine fish earned Marshall the September Big Fish award of \$50. Marshall's Big Fish was a ³/₄ lb Smelt. Did you catch a bigger fish? If you did why didn't you turn it in for the monthly prize?

The Annual Scampi Dinner and Anglers awards scheduled for November 15th had to be canceled because the dinning room will be under construction. The Anglers Awards will be presented during the Club Awards dinner on December 20th.

The Thresher Shark fishery has been heavily impacted over the last few years. These fine food and fighting fish have become an increasingly popular target for both recreational and commercial fishermen. They are particularly vulnerable during the Pupping season, commonly though to be between June and August when they move inshore and are more easily caught. Because of this the Pacific Fisheries Management Council (PFMC) will consider new regulations during their November $1^{st} - 7^{th}$ meeting in San Diego Ca.

This will be considered at the next PFMC meeting in San Diego November 1st - 7th 2008 Highly Migratory Species Management

Changes to Routine Management Measures for 2009-10 Seasons

The Council adopted a range of alternatives to address catch of thresher shark in both commercial and recreational fisheries and identified preliminary preferred alternatives among the range. The preliminary preferred alternative is a recreational shark fishery closure throughout California and a commercial seasonal shark closure south of Point Conception, both for the period February 1-August 14 of each year. Other options under consideration for the recreational fishery include: (1) bag limits, season limits, and boat limits; (2) a requirement to use fishing gear to reduce foul hooking; and (3) mandatory reporting of catch by shark tournaments. The no action alternative is also being considered. The Council also requested NMFS to make a regulatory change to allow vessel marking in compliance with rules established by the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Commission that require the display of the International Radio Call Sign on vessels fishing west of 150° W longitude.



Hello Boaters and Waterfront Lovers



WEATHER:

The weather is right on schedule with our Indian Summer condition. Fortunately we have had no Santa Ana wind storms as of this writing Oct. 9. Great!

Our weather should remain calm until after the new year.

Plan your outer island trip now while the fall conditions are present. Remember to listen for Northeasterly winds.

FISHING:

Fishing remains good with a fair amount of Bonito being caught on the outside edges of the kelp beds. The Bonito is probably the fastest swimming and powerful small tuna of all.

During the period between 1960 and 1980 there were so many Bonito the sport fishing boats I had crewed on would have to move so our customers would be able to catch something other than Bonito. To give one an idea how many and how aggressive feeders the Bonito were in those years when I was probably 12 years old I laid down on the deck on my stomach and had the other dockhand hold down my feet so I could lean over the side of the boat and hand fed the Bonito.

Over the next twenty years through commercial fishing activity the Bonito was reduced to two or three percent of there normal stocks. The Bonito was not a top priority to save due to sporfishermen not wanting Bonito Tuna because of the short shelf life. Like all tunas they require fast cleaning and refrigeration or icing after being caught. In the earlier sport fishing years, fish caught on sport fishing boats were kept at room temperature hung in potato sack (gunny sacks) on hooks around the outside of huge bait tanks for six to eight hours. Every time someone came to the bait tank to get a live anchovy they stepped on the fish. Now we have warm mushy ready for the rose garden fertilizer not a great eating fish the Bonito is. I often used "Fillet Mignon would not be the same if you left it at room temperature, stepped on it 10 times or left it out on the swim step in the hot sun and then into the frying pan. I was on a trip recently with a customer/friend fishing at the Tanner Bank and the first fish boated was a 8-10 pound Bonito. I gilled and gutted it, slid it right into an iced cooler to chill. After one hour I fillet the bonito and made fresh sushi using soy sauce and lime juice to cold cook. We also had Blue fin Tuna prepared the same way that day and the bonito was favored. Keep cold and clean your fish as you catch them.



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

With the wind climbing past 30 knots, **Perfect Balance** turned for home, drinking beer (not the kids) laughing and smiling.
