

Angler's dues of \$10 for the 2014 fishing season are now due. Please send in your Angler's dues with your regular club dues billing. If you forgot and sent the dues in without the anglers' dues you can provide a SEPARATE check made out to "Channel Islands Yacht Club, Anglers" and put Anglers Dues in the memo section of the check and send it or bring it to the Club.

We intend for this to be an exciting and fun-filled year. If you are a current member you know the drill, but for those of you who are new and may want to join in the fun here are the details:

For only ten bucks you will have a distinctive looking fish next to your name in the CIYC roster, participate in the Club's Tournaments and be eligible for the \$50 Big Fish of the Month Award, as well as the \$100 Big Fish of the Year Award.

Doc Lines

Back to the Future

This is a summary of some thingies published in 2013 in the Currents:

Always wash your hands (to prevent Noro-virus diarrhea) while cooking your Mediterranean dinner (to prolong your life's longevity) and preparing Cannabis salad (which is full of antioxidants), while drinking coffee (which is good for you).

While you are at it, drink only moderate amounts of alcohol (no more than one or two drinks per day), lest you be arrested for DUI with a BAL of 0.8%. And realize that you've had one too many when you become overly talkative, too loud, and do socially unacceptable things!

In case you can't see your genitals while naked, you are probably overweight. To get rid of belly fat, stop eating wheat products (flour, bread, rolls, pasta, cereal) because they contain gluten and easily digestible polysaccharides, which furiously and rapidly raise blood glucose levels and are addictive. Even worse is wheat laced with sugar (doughnuts, cakes, cookies, pastries), and also bad are sugary canned drinks saturated with high fructose corn syrup. And please don't smoke. But if you are that weak-minded and you cannot help yourself, better to use e-cigs. We are still waiting for an e-condom.

And the Good News About the Future?

1) Just as bacteria can infect us, there are things that can infect and kill bacteria. They are small clumps of proteins called bacteriophages. Among some 56 proteins making up a bacteriophage, there is one, numbered 0.4, that is deadly to *E. coli*, and possibly to other bacteria and bacilli such as those that cause sexually transmitted diseases, tuberculosis, and MRSA. As these superbugs are now increasingly resistant to conventional antibiotics, this is a welcome discovery.

2) Need a new kidney? Or a new heart? No problem. Soon 3D printing will be here to help. It is now possible to 3D sculpt at a resolution of 16 microns. That is the resolution of a single cell. So far, successfully printed matrices allowed autologus (from patients' own cells) reconstructions of ear and nose. The most optimistic projection is for a functional autologus heart to be produced by 2020. The biggest problem is to produce a functioning network of blood vessels to bring nutrients and remove waste products from cells deposited on the vascular frame. 3D printing may have an interesting effect on prolonging longevity and thereby increasing the world's population. I wonder if Obamacare will cover these procedures. And what about medical ethics? This is a really interesting subject to follow.

Another approach is to use a pig's kidney (which is remarkably similar to ours), depopulate it of its cells, leaving only a translucent matrix. Next, repopulate the matrix with the patient's own stem cells (derived from skin cells). Some 90,000 US residents are in need of a kidney transplant. Current capacity is only 17,000/yr.


- 3) Smart skin: Think of a temporary tattoo patch. Except this one can accurately sense the body's temperature, blood glucose level, state of hydration, blood oxygen content, blood cell count, or levels of circulating medications. Not only can smart skin sense those things, it can also wirelessly transmit that information to your doctor. It also could deliver some medications and heat to the region. Long gone are the days of the rectal thermometer. YAARRR!!
- 4) For a long time we thought only stem cells could transform into defined organ cells, and once that happened, there was no going back. Now scientists at UCSB claim that every cell has the genetic potential to become any other cell. Thus a liver cell could become a brain cell. You could be thinking with your liver and double your intellectual capacity. Kidding aside, this has enormous potential.
- 5) Tinkering with grape seed extract: Several studies have shown that grape seed extract has anti-cancerous effects. It took awhile to pinpoint and isolate B2G2 as the most active compound, but it is expensive and difficult to isolate and purify. However, scientists went on to synthesize it and were successful. Now it is cheap, and about to undergo clinical trials.
- 6) Digital breast tomosynthesis (DBT) is 3D mammography, and it was found to be way better than standard mammography. It will take some time before it is available at your local mammography center, but it never hurts to ask.
- 7) Drones delivering medications to your door? That is highly probable, especially in rural areas. Drones may even peek through the windows to check if you are home. Then somebody will develop a pirate drone in order to steal from the delivery drone. Then the delivery drone will need a protective escort drone, well armed...and...
