# Message From The Commodore **Larry Golkin**







This summer, CIYC is in full swing to bring you the most and best activities possible. There will be fine meals, dinghy parties. cruising, sailboat racing, and more. As a rule, each week we bring you

movies, bingo and bocce ball. Come and enjoy yourselves. The Club is open 6 nights a week for your pleasure. Come breathe a little.

At the June General Meeting, the Nominating Committee was formalized. The committee includes, Sylvia Hyde, Tom Warden, Connie Calo, Bob Deyling and Barbara Brauns. Their task is to select several persons from the membership to replace the outgoing members of the Board of Directors. For those of you who do not know, Director nominations may also be made from the floor at the August General Membership Meeting. So, if you have a candidate in mind, you may nominate them even if the Nominating Committee did not. It is simply possible that the Nominating Committee overlooked someone they were not terribly familiar with who is totally suited for the position. Then, you will vote at the September General Meeting.

Service on the Board of Directors means more than an identifiable name tag. It can be a lot of work. The Board meets monthly on a formal basis. However, it meets more often when it needs to. CIYC is a corporation and runs like a mid-sized business. The biggest difference is that this "business" does not have customers; it has members. This makes the operation of the club significantly different from many other business operations in several ways. First and foremost, whereas customers come to buy something or to eat, members come to enjoy themselves. Board members must be responsible to see that members enjoy themselves in what has oft been referred to as their "home away from home." In that regard, one of the principle responsibilities of the Board of Directors is the election of new members the folks we invite into our home away from home.

Members of the Board need to be familiar with our club's By-Laws. Complicating this is the fact that the By-Laws are currently under revision, so whatever one thinks they know about the By-Laws now, may prove interesting when the new set is finally complete. (I mentioned to you previously that the By-Law Committee is working this out as I write this, but I do not have a definitive date for completion from the Committee). Members of the Board should also take it upon themselves to become familiar with not only yacht club traditions, but CIYC traditions. This is difficult as it seems every time you think you know about a few, more spring up. It seems our club has a tradition for almost everything. Board members should not be afraid to change things, but should be cognizant that, in a world of traditions, some things do not change quickly, and perhaps should not change at all. So, striking a balance between new business and old ways is sometimes complicated.

Members of the Board should be familiar with business and accounting. Our club is a small business with an operating budget of nearly \$300,000 per year in combined income and expense. It's no joke. Folks that are interested in running for the Board, or who you think you might nominate for the Board, had better understand that they will be spending someone else's money, and must do so conscientiously, with an eye towards fiscal conservatism in these difficult economic times. It's simply not enough to say, "go ahead and spend it." Board members must be capable of financial analysis. Things have changed in recent years and simply having been a member for a long time, is no longer a relevant criteria. You should select and elect people who have run businesses, either their own company, or who have been in some kind of executive level or administrative position. Again, love for your dub is fine, but it does not necessarily help keep balanced books and it certainly does not fill the kitty. In that regard, in my opinion, some accounting background is a must, or at least the training, background, and experience to understand general principles of accounting and balance sheet analysis is crucial.

Once on the Board, these members will be tasked with running the club. The Board makes policy level decisions while the Bridge (Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore) are essentially tasked with running the dayto-day operation of the club. So, while the Board does not necessarily involve daily management duties, it does establish the overall policies that govern daily management. Hopefully, the Bridge works well with the rest of the Board and good things evolve from the combined effort. The members of the Board serve a two year term.

Some of you, if you are new to the club and have not spent hours pouring over the By-Laws, may not realize that the Bridge come from the Board. In other words, to be a Bridge officer, you must be selected from the (not by the) Board of Directors. Once the Board is elected in September, then you will nominate and elect the Bridge. The Bridge is elected in October. The Bridge serves for one year starting January 1.

One learns a great deal about how the club runs when serving on the Board or Bridge. There is an awful lot to learn in a very short time. Nevertheless, the experience is rewarding. For me, there is nothing more rewarding than seeing a building full of folks having a good time and not even concerned with how it happened. For my part, I want the membership to take it for granted that there will be a meal every Wednesday night; that there will be hand towels in the restrooms; that there will be fun socials; that there will be a competitive sailing program; and, that there will be opportunities for cruisers. Perhaps even more than that, is the joy I experience when someone comes to me with an idea they want to try and then they get to experience the fun and happiness when their event goes off well - without any micromanagement whatsoever. Sometimes things blossom. Sometimes things merely sprout and then wither on the vine. But, it was attempted and that is what counts. Creativity is hard when you are trying to bring something to a club that has been in existence for 49 years. It is even more difficult when you consider that the membership we have is made up of so many motivated and creative people, some of whom have been part of CIYC for all or many of those years. Thus, the saying, "been there, done that." Yet, for those of you who have ideas, keep bringing them. It is always possible to do something that has not been done before, or in a long time.....and with a twist of your own.

In conclusion, our club faces many challenges in the future. Be very cognizant of this fact when you chose the next Board of Directors. For my part, I have been blessed with a very talented, hard working group of people who really want only what is in the best interests of the club. We may fight from time to time, and we may disagree. But, it is not personal. It is business, and we work things out in a fashion that benefits everyone, or at least, as many as we can. Chose wisely and vote. Voting is a privilege of Regular Membership. Please do not take it for granted.

# Message From The Vice Commodore Mary Foster




Your Racers do it again: What stellar performances your team are doing.

Again, I must say that time is moving so quickly!



Of course, the calendar is preliminary at this point. And the rules and the protocol are still being formulated.
