WSB Grow-out Pen Update:

Tuesday, July 29th through the 31st (3 days), we did a final count of the WSB in our Grow-out pens. We needed this much time because we estimated almost 10K fish in each pen, so we did one pen a day. We used the automatic counter and the sluice pipe again. Thank you to all of our volunteers who helped out each day. Derrick from Hubs Sea World Research Institute was there to help with this process. He was in charge of getting the length and weights of a sample of the fish and scanning for tags in them. He collected fish to take back to the DFW pathologist, so our fish can get cleared for release. Once our fish are cleared by the pathologist, we still be able to release them. We should be ready to release the fish in the third week of August.

Fishing:

Gary Johnson did an exploratory Fishing trip on Joy Sea in July. He went to Santa Barbara Island for some Ocean White Fish and Rock Fish, then to San Nicholas Island for almost no fish. From there, they went to Santa Rosa Island for a couple of White Sea Bass and lost about a 40lb Halibut at the surface! They returned home on July 22nd to complete the circle.

Measles Vaccine & Cancer

There is exciting news from the Mayo Clinic. A woman with multiple myeloma, an incurable type of blood cancer, was not responding to any type of conventional therapy, including radiation and chemotherapy. The distributed lumps of cancerous tumor were everywhere, even behind her forehead, compressing the brain.

In desperation, the doctors decided to give her a fortified measles vaccine. How much fortified? Enough to vaccinate one million individuals against measles. But it is also an engineered virus (MV-NIS), which was designed to be selectively toxic to myeloma cells.

The response was dramatic. In a day or two, the patient developed a high fever. The multiple myeloma cells started bursting and the cancerous lumps melted away. An incurable patient is now cancer-free. After one injection! Truly remarkable!!!

Re-engineered viruses, to fight cancer, have been tried before (oncolytic virotherapy), but they were largely unsuccessful.

Now, this is just a case report, but it will immediately initiate clinical trials with other patients with the same disease, and also for patients with all kinds of other types of cancers. This discovery deserves to be followed for further developments.

MS and Stem Cell Treatment In Mice

Multiple Sclerosis is an auto-immune disorder whereby myelin, the insulating tissue around nerve fibers, is attacked and stripped away. Nerves can no longer transmit impulses, leading to symptoms such as motor dysfunction.

Scientists at the University of Utah injected genetically-engineered mice (with all the symptoms of MS) with human stem cells. Within less than two weeks, the paralyzed mice were walking again. Six months later there was no relapse.

The thinking is that chemical signals from the stem cells instructed each mouse's own cells to repair the damage. They identified a protein called TGF-beta that might have been responsible. So research now can concentrate on using the patient's own stem cells, or, more likely, developing a drug based on the TGF-beta protein. It will be interesting to follow up on this line of research, but it will take some time to see if it does work in humans.







Interview with Bev and John Richardson By: Dan Jordan

What led you to join CIYC?



His company then transferred him to an inland job, marking the end of serious boat for many years, but John continued fishing whenever he was close to a coastal region.

John and Bev moved to California in 1984, and he changed careers, becoming a full time citrus grower. John retired from the citrus business two years ago and now has a 40' Black Watch. John says this is his ideal boat. If they could "cast off the dock lines" for an extended period, Bev and John would take a world cruise, but it would have to be on a boat with fewer than 100 passengers.

About club activities, John definitely wants to get involved with the Anglers, and Bev will likely start to help with some of the cooking events. About CIYC itself, they say "We have been members of CIYC for less than two weeks, but so far we would recommend the club to others. We would mention the numerous activities available, the welcoming and inclusive nature of the group, and the overall enthusiasm shared by the members we have met."
