May 24th Zoran & Erika Barbaric arranged for our 4th Classical Guitar Recital. As always a great program and standing room only to enjoy this great presentation.



DO YOU KNOW? Bud and Phyllis Gerding

Bud grew up in Santa Paula and enjoyed playing almost all High School sports. He loved snow skiing. Phyllis grew up in Burbank and attended Burbank High School. She was an excellent water skier and loved riding her dirt bike in the desert.

In 1944 while still a junior in High school, Bud enlisted with the US Maritime Service to support WWII. He trained to be a sailor on Catalina Island, and sailed aboard the merchant marine ship US Weir Cook to the South Pacific, Philippines and Japan. At the end of WWII (1945), the US Navy gave the ship to the Japanese and brought the ship's crew back to the US.

Bud returned to finish high school and Ventura College. With the start of the Korean War, Bud was with the US Army's 40th Infantry Division located at Camp Cook, California. The Army then released Bud to the US Navy, where he learned to fly at Pensacola,

Florida. Bud qualified as a naval carrier pilot on the USS Cabot, August 27, 1952, in the Gulf of Mexico.

After his military service, Bud attended the National School for Electronics and the Don Martin School of Radio. His first job was at Bing Crosby Enterprises and later at Lockheed's Missiles & Space Division in Burbank California, providing missile launch support at Cape Canaveral, FL and Vandenberg, CA. Bud met Phyllis in the Microfilm Operations department. They were married on November 13, 1972.

Bud became a Senior Systems Engineer / Program Manager for several super secret programs in Lockheed's famed Skunk Works. For more than 22 years, he was on the US Air Force's "SR-71" Blackbird program, traveling around the world to support the aircraft's missions. He says "this was a very exciting time and it was a Great Job; really made the heart beat faster...but because of the incredible secrecy, you couldn't talk about it!"

As you may recall, during late 50's the Blackbird was the fastest (30 miles per minute) and highest (80,000+) aircraft to ever fly, and safely returned surveillance photos from any place in the world. Over 4000 missiles were fired at it....... and it was never touched!

Bud and Phyllis lived in Silverstrand, Mandalay Bay and Hueneme Bay and enjoyed a second home in Palm Springs. While at Lockheed, Bud commuted from Oxnard to Burbank every day flying his private plane marveling at the stop-and-go traffic on the freeways below. They have traveled most of the US and Canada in their RV motor home. Bud was also a California Real estate agent for 58 years.



Bud and Phyllis joined CIYC in 1980 and still enjoy the Club's great socializing, food, drink, golfing and Casino Parties and often travel in Club events.

So when you see Bud and Phyllis at the Club, please say hello and perhaps reminisce with a very interesting couple.

Why Do We Sleep?

Sleep has restorative effects: These include brain development, memory processing, immune function, and a 15% decreased metabolic rate. All noble things, but they don't explain why all animals die within a few weeks of sleep deprivation.

This brings us to the lymphatic circulatory system. Its primary function is to drain protein molecules, and other metabolites, from spaces between the cells (interstitial spaces). Unable to enter blood capillaries, these molecules enter the small lymph vessels, which coalesce into one bigger vessel and drain into a large vein just behind the left collarbone. If left behind, the proteins attract water and cause swelling (edema). The liver is the biggest contributor to lymph flow, because it's a protein factory. About 2-3 liters of lymph drains into the venous system during every 24- hour period. Forward flow is by muscular contraction, respiratory pressures, some smooth muscle contractions in the larger lymph vessels, and unidirectional valves. The secondary function is to "filter" and kill bacteria via the lymph nodes, and to transport fat from the bowel to the liver.

Compared with other organs, the brain has a ten times greater metabolic function, and thus a corresponding amount of proteins and metabolic stuff dumped between the cells. And yet it has no lymphatic system! So how does the bad stuff get out of there, you ask?

What happens is that cerebrospinal fluid (CSF) diffuses in between the cells and flushes it out. It does so by entering spaces around small penetrating arteries along the periphery, and exiting in small spaces around the veins on the other side. These are called perivascular spaces and recently have been named the *glymphatic system*. This is a flush-out type of cleansing, driven also by the brain pulsating with arterial pressure.

A major recent discovery at the University of Rochester, NY, is that the *glymphatic system* undergoes dramatic dilatation and enlargement during sleep. And the interstitial spaces also significantly enlarge. Enlargement of all these spaces makes CSF flushing so much more efficient in getting rid of metabolites. These then enter the venous system and are expelled via the kidneys or reprocessed by the liver.

So, that's it in a nutshell. We need sleep to open up the draining system and flush the brain clean - just as tides flush the harbor. During waking hours this flushing system is not functional. It's too busy thinking. The things that adversely affect this function are trauma, stroke, and, unfortunately, aging. That's why it's important to get a good night's sleep, and even a short nap during the day. Every teenager will tell you that, but now you know why.

Pirating of Public Land for Private Profit: More Apartments, More Traffic - Is This Our Vision for our Beautiful Harbor?

Channel Islands Harbor is an exceptionally beautiful harbor that we enjoy and love. Now its prized public owned waterside lands are to be developed for the enjoyment of a privileged few and the profit of a single developer.

On May 3rd, many issues were buried within ERNs (Exclusive Right to Negotiate), granted by the Board of Supervisors (BOS) and the Harbor Department (HD) to the Channel Islands Properties LLC (CIHP). The ERNs in question had expired over a year ago after CIHP did nothing and failed to fulfill their requirements within deadlines. Even after many in the community voiced their concerns, the BOS voted to reward CIHP's failure by extending their ERNs for one year.

In doing so, the BOS jeopardized the recently approved (March 22nd) Brighton Management (BM) hotel project replacing the Casa Sirena. This ERN for F and F-1 parcels gives CIHP the right to force Brighton Management back into negotiations for sections of these parcels originally included in BM's approved plan with height variances for the hotel, public parking and promenades. Per the Harbor Director, BM's Plan is already at the Coastal Commission for review and approval to start construction.

Another expired ERN was for the X-3 parcel designated in the PWP for a Community Center. Now CIHP has a 1-year ERN for this prime parcel located between the Vintage Marina Office and the Duffy Boats Office without having to declare what they intend to do with this prime property.

CIHP is the same developer proposing a "mixed use development" of 390 apartments with over 600 resident parking spaces at the Fisherman's Wharf area with a 65-year lease. With almost 2,000 new housing units coming into the area, is this the best use of our prime public land?

Wouldn't the Fisherman's Wharf area be an incredible harbor park with picnic tables, promenades with harbor vistas and benches, visitor-serving businesses, a Chumash exhibit, a marine learning center, a children's museum, restaurants, and lots of parking, bike racks and a public docking area?

This prominent public land is a natural portal to the harbor and can potentially be its most promotable landmark. Our harbor is one of the most beautiful harbors on the West Coast and the gateway to the magnificent islands and ocean national park described as the "Galapagos of California". Shouldn't it be developed as the beacon to our Channel Islands National Park?

At the May 3rd meeting, it was also learned that the CIHP's managing partner is now Geoff Palmer, a developer with a history peppered with negative articles like these:

• LA files \$20 million lawsuit against Da Vinci Apartments developer (a Geoff Palmer development) claiming its negligence was responsible for the damage caused by a massive fire that forced closure of 110 freeway and \$80 million in damages to a nearby city building – February 18, 2016 LA Times

- Downtown LA's mixed-users are full of empty storefronts that on paper make sense but without retail tenants actually moving in, it all falls apart. It's Geoff Palmer vicious circle, the retail spaces in his enormous "fauxtalian fortresses" are rarely occupied February 17, 2015 Curbed News
 Builder given 5-year penalty for demolishing the last 19th century home on Bunker Hill without a
- Builder given 5-year penalty for demolishing the last 19th century home on Bunker Hill without a permit. David Keim, the chief code enforcement officer at the City's Department of Building and Safety, said he believed it was the first time his agency had invoked this ordinance to halt construction August 29, 2003 LA Times
- G.H. Palmer Associates to pay fines for laundering of campaign funds after the state's Fair Political Practices Commission found the company had committed 15 violations of the California Political Reform Act August 29, 2003 LA Times
- Geoff Palmer among Beverly Hills top water wasters, his household used more than 12,000 gallons of water a day during a two-month period, and facing a penalty. Palmer appealed in January. March 14, 2016 LA Times

Is this a developer who should be given exclusive access to our prized public harbor land?

On June 7, 2016, the Board of Supervisors meet at the Ventura County Administration Building to decide if the 11.4 acres of public land, known as the Fisherman's Wharf area, should be turned over to CIHP for 390 exclusive luxury apartments development.

The BOS must require a thoroughly vetted INDEPENDENT EIR (Environmental Impact Report) and a PROPER TRAFFIC STUDY for a proposal that may impact wildlife, increase traffic and endanger lives should an emergency exit be required out of the Silver Strand area and other sections of the harbor community.

Update on the Channel Islands Boating Center (CIBC)

On May 17th, the Harbor Department is seeking Board of Supervisors' approval to execute the first Operating Agreement for the CIBC between the County of Ventura and the Trustees of the California State University, through the CSUCI. Incredibly, since the CIBC opened 3 years ago, there has only been a lease agreement in effect.

Access to the facility by the harbor community, yacht clubs and general public appears to remain limited at best; is not consistent with what had been originally promised, and not a real concern of either the Harbor Department nor the CSUCI.


