

While on a Mexican Rivera Cruise with a group from CIYC, I went on a short fishing charter in Mazatlan with Dick Olsen, Pat Korecky, and Bill Magee. The day was a great experience. Although the fishing was slow, we all managed to catch one fish. Dick caught a very nice Dorado while the rest of us caught Bonita. Our target was marlin and we did see one finning, on the surface, but could not get him to bite. One of the other boats in our fleet caught a very nice 8.5 foot Sailfish.

WSB Update:

We have taken delivery of another 10,000 fish to the grow out pens. We now have a total of about 25,000 to 30,000 fish in the 3 holding pens. The fish in the center pen were delivered with some problems and there has been a die off that we are getting under control.

Hello Boater and Waterfront Lovers!

Weather

Weather conditions are right on course with great flat seas between mild Southwest winds, which is our best weather of the year. If you have never been to the Northern Channel Islands, go **now** - no crowds and the weather will closely resemble Santa Barbara 's climate. Keep an ear out for the Santa Ana wind conditions, monitoring Channel 3 on your VHF regularly. Keep in mind if you get caught, go northwest to escape.

Fishing

About the time we get the great weather, the DFG rules close the ling cod fishing (which seems to me a little unfair, especially if you like to fish the shallow waters around San Miguel Island and the West end of Santa Rosa, as I do). There also good **Red Snapper** fishing in these areas. This time of the year, most rockfish are spawning and it has been my experience in the past to see large numbers gathering on high spots (reef areas) rocky areas. When we used to fish hook and line commercially (market fishing) for Red Snapper, we used to look primarily in the 45 to 65 fathom range. We would generally look close to the rocky areas - say a 500' radius. Red Snapper readings (illustrations on your fish finder display) are visible if you are not looking for these fish stay tight to the bottom, as they spread out when they feed. Once you locate Reds and drop baited hooks down to them, they will tighten up their school and begin to column up from the bottom. I have seen this happen on most occasions. When they start this column, they will stop your baits going down and you will limit out quickly. So when your are metering, keep a close eye on the bottom line, until you see very dense marks on the bottom.

When searching for best areas for **Rockfish**, simply go to a published chart for the area you plan on fishing and look for (rky) markings in 15 to 50 fathoms. **Lobster** fishing started out pretty good, but I think that fishing pressure has affected the catch numbers. I did go out once, so far this year. We caught 38 lobsters - 35 were short in length; and we got 4 rock crabs and 2 Banjo Sharks for 4 hours fishing. This is about10% as good as the all time great fishing we have seen in the pre-100 year flood seasons. The DFG may have to step up conservation efforts along the Ventura coastal zones, until the population stabilizes to their normal numbers.

Clamming seems be the sure bet for this fall and winter. We have been out once as of this article, and caught 5 Pismo Clams apiece in a little under an hour. These clams are along the beaches from the Santa Clara River to Pt. Mugu. Simply use a manure fork like a probe. Walk backwards and stick the fork down into the sandy ocean bottom about 4-6 inches until you strike a hard object. Push your fork all the way down and push down on the handle end while taking your left hand and feeling about the area for the clam. Use your legal clam measuring device (4 1/2") to make sure your clam is big enough. This is probably the easiest, least fishy, family-friendly activity available. Try clamming soon; you will be glad you did and they are great to eat. Good Luck!

Boats

I was hoping to make a New England sea trial prior to heavy weather arriving but the early snow and blizzard conditions may have me going in the spring. Fuel prices are still dropping which is a welcome plus for all boaters. One can only hope they keep going down.
