

New Smoking Policy

After several hours of debate on two separate occasions, over a period of a month, the Board of Directors, pursuant to its authority granted in Article III, Section 10 of the CIYC Bylaws, have amended the House Rules to effectuate a new smoking policy for CIYC. Effective immediately, the House Rules, located on page 59 of the 2009 CIYC Roster, shall be amended to state as follows:

Rule 16: Smoking shall not be permitted in areas designated "Non Smoking".

A cut out will appear in the next issue of the Currents so you may paste it into your new Roster.

The area designated "Non Smoking" shall be that area 15 feet on either side of the center of the sliding glass door leading onto the balcony. Smokers may enjoy their "smokes" anywhere else on the premises (except inside, of course). This means on either side of the above-referenced area, on either of the roof decks, or in the back patio. The designated "Non Smoking" area will be marked with small plaques.

The rationale behind this decision focuses on certain essential considerations. First, second hand smoke makes many people uncomfortable, not only due to the apparent health risk, but also in connection with the relatively unpleasant odor. Second, the Board believes it is necessary to spread out the crowd on the balcony in an effort to ease the traffic that congests access on and off the balcony. The Board is further considering how to make the balcony areas more comfortable and enjoyable for all members.

While the Board expects a certain amount of criticism from certain members, it also expects that this policy will make the club a more enjoyable and attractive place for all members, and hopes all members will comply with this House Rule, as well as all the other House Rules.

As I Remember----Goleta State Park Historian - Bud Gerding

Early in the 1970s, CIYC Cruisers started an annual cruise to Goleta State Park located on the beach by the Santa Barbara Airport. I started to write a story about this annual cruise but I located a report written by Ellie Bishop, which is a better story than I could provide. Here is Ellie's entire story with a note at the end of her story.

"Goleta, what a time CIYC has had there. I remember one August Saturday morning {early} we loaded our boat the Four Seas with steaks, fresh corn on the cob, butter, garlic bread, salad fixings, paper goods, and pots and pans of different shapes and sizes. Everyone on board we headed for the gas dock. While there, it was noticed that the water pump was leaking in the bilge. "My God, what do we do now?" Jim Donlon was our guest for the trip along with the Hamiltons and my daughter Kathy. We limped back to the D dock and Jimmy went to pick up the Pescador. When he and the boat arrived we transferred our cargo over to his boat. Undaunted with a fresh Bloody Mary in hand, we headed for Goleta. Our trip took us about two hours but we enjoyed the excursion.

What a sight when you come around the bend from Santa Barbara to Goleta. It's a calm little cove and beautiful beach. After we anchored, the cargo had to be taken ashore. Mel and Joyce Thrasher were already there and their dinghy had a motor. What a help that was. We loaded the cargo in their dinghy and ours, and motored and rowed over to this little dinky Pier {and I mean dinky}. Unloading our precious cargo up the little steps and the other side. We carried and pulled all of it over to the barbecue area. Other boats arrived, anchored and came ashore, using the little pier for a day of eating, drinking and play. The stashes appeared {no drinking allowed on the beach}, cards were dealt, checkers were put out but the game of the day was the Big Ball. That Ball was a popular sport. I remember Commodore Don Olin getting on top and staying for a minute or two. Patty Ryan decided to give the Ball a try and proceed to make the plunge, WHOOPS down she came over the other side. Not a good idea for Patty.

She broke her wrist. Taken off the playing field like a good champ, she was taken to the hospital and returned with a

cast on her, but just in time for the barbecue.

In the meantime, the garlic was left aboard the **Pescador**, so the brave ones, Bob Hamilton with Ruth Hatcher at

the helm took her dinghy over to the boat and picked it up. On their way back—just as they got a few feet from shore, a rouge wave hit them and over they went. Bob lost his glasses, but held on to the garlic and Ruth won the wet tee shirt contest.

<u>Donlon</u> and <u>Hamilton</u> prepared the steaks, corn, bread, and salad. The corn was very special, dripping with butter and garlic. The party lasted till sunset and the boaters headed back to their boats; and those that drove headed home. Alas, you asked what happened to those pots and pans. Well someone, I can't remember, offered to take them back to the Club by car, what a relief. From that time on, the Abbotts brought all the cargo in their RV and we only had to get ourselves ashore. We had wonderful evenings out on our boats, visiting each other, eating and drinking.

The last time we went to **Goleta** {about 1980}, the little pier was gone and we all used dinghies to get ashore. I miss Goleta and the great fun everyone had."

END of Ellie's great story, Thank you Ellie.

NOTE: Actually the visits to **Goleta** didn't really end until late 1980s. The last visit I attended was in 1989, again with <u>Tom and Margarite Abbotts</u> RV transporting the cargo. At the completion of the games and barbecue the party ended and people began to leave the park. The boat people returned to their boats to continue with some on board fun and spend the night at anchor. As the folks who arrived by auto began to leave the park a bystander on the sidewalk "Mooned" the vehicles as they passed by. I cannot believe that this bystander could ever be a member of CIYC, at least from the visible exposure. The boat people remained overnight then headed back to Channels Harbor with a planned Brunch stop at the **Scotch & Sirloin Restaurant** in Ventura Harbor. CIYC members were easy to identify by their bright yellow club jackets. **Goleta** was a great event; Great fun was had by all, many good memories.


